Hello Families,

We hope you are getting excited about attending our student Celebration of Learning on **March 13th!** We are happy to share the following, so you know what to expect for your grade level experience.

Grade 6 students have been working diligently to complete their Celestial Communities where they have integrated most of their subjects into a community. They have written a new Charter of Rights and Freedoms, have explored the planet in which their community exists, found the area and perimeter of buildings, and have written numerous pieces of information explaining their community and the attractions in their community! We cannot wait to showcase these Celestial Communities at our Celebration of Learning evening!

The Grade 7 students will be celebrating their learning by sharing their inquiry-based activities with their families. Our cross-curricular approach to education provides an opportunity for you to engage in experiences that integrate multiple subjects. Students and their families are invited to participate in design sprint challenges, listen to podcasts, news reports, and myths about a natural disaster of their choice, and explore structures designed to withstand a simulated earthquake. Additionally, we encourage families to visit our school library, where our annual Book Fair will be set up, offering a wide selection of books to browse and purchase.

Grade 8 FI students have been working hard at creating multimedia projects in multiple subjects. Students will be able to demonstrate the steps to take in order to create a podcast, and a green screen image to represent a variety of governments. There will also be an opportunity to participate in a French game, a math game and a science lab exploring the viscosity of different fluids. For Health and Français, students have made their own goal-setting BINGO sheets that are helping to guide them through the end of their middle school careers.

Grade 8 English students will be celebrating their learning of various coding skills by demonstrating the challenges they created for the STEAM Day of play. There will also be opportunities for students and their families to engage in math challenges geared toward the skills they have been learning in mathematics. In addition, all grade 8 students will be showcasing their multimodal works in ELA and Social Studies.
