All About Art

Hello future Grade 6 Students, parents, and guardians! My name is Ms. Savinkoff, and I am the art teacher here at Robert Andrews Middle School. Below you will find the information you need to know about art in order to decide if it's right for you. Who is art for?

Art and band are both inclusive. Anyone who would like to participate in art class is welcome!

What does creating art teach us?

The Manitoba Visual Arts Curriculum is based on four parts with the individual student artist at its center. In the Visual Arts Framework, the four parts of essential learning areas are: Making, Creating, Connecting and Responding. In art class, we learn about a variety of different ways to create art, how to express ourselves, how to use different art supplies, what is the role of art in everyday life, art history, how to assess art of the Art Masters and our own art. Educational and neurological research show many benefits of producing art such as improving literacy and numeracy skills, problem solving, making connections between prior knowledge and new information, process emotions, build creativity, sharing, team building, as well as strengthening fine motor control.

What does art look like every day?

Every day in the art class can look different depending on what we are doing. What stays the same in every class, is the focus on the growth of the individual student artist and the student artist's self-expression. The year is broken down into three parts with a focus on drawing, painting and sculpture. There is a main project each term based on a theme and an art medium. In addition, each student artist is required to complete a minimum of 10 pieces of art in the student artist's personal idea book (sketch book). At Robert Andrews Middle School, we have a wheel and a kiln so working in clay is a highlight experience for our student artists in each grade.

What does art look like long term?

During regular programming, there are different ways for student artists to get their artwork seen by the public. Student artwork is on display throughout the school. Robert Andrews student artists can participate in the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra and River East Transcona School Division art show at the Centennial Concert Hall every fall (one evening) as well as the River East Transcona School Division Middle Years Art Display at Kildonan Place the last Monday in April for a week. Student artists may also participate in the Royal Canadian Legion poster contest. Student artists may also enter other art contests. We also have opportunities to work with visiting artists.

Assessment

One concern is how do I do well in art? Each student artist is on a continuum of learning, and their artwork is assessed on an individual basis, not in comparison to anyone else's work. We learn about goal setting, strengths and challenges, as well as next steps in developing our skills as a student artist. Another concern is about drawing or painting in a realistic style. Drawing or painting in a realistic style might be a personal goal but not a learning goal for our art class.

How much does art cost?

At Robert Andrews Middle School, we have an art fee of \$35 per year to cover the cost of an art kit of supplies. Each student artist gets an art kit that has a variety of good quality supplies so all of the student artists have the same supplies. Each year, the art kit has an idea book (sketch book), drawing supplies and painting supplies. Each year, there are different paint brushes so it helps build a non-consumable art kit for the student artist. Other supplies are consumable and will be replaced the following year in the next art kit or as needed.

All About Band

Hello future Grade 6 Students, parents, and guardians! My name is Ms. Hodge, and I am the band teacher here at Robert Andrews Middle School. Below are the answers to some commonly asked questions and concerns about band!

Who is band for?

Everyone is welcome! Band and art are both inclusive. Even students who feel they aren't musical or don't like music will have fun and find success in band!

What instruments do we play in band?

In a typical band there are woodwind instruments, brass instruments, and percussion. These include flute, oboe, clarinet, bass clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, french horn, trombone, euphonium, tuba, drums, and more! We also have bass guitars in our program, and electric guitars and pianos in our jazz bands!

What are the benefits of band?

Research shows that playing an instrument is a "full-brain workout," as it uses all areas of the brain at once! This helps build skills such as problem solving, goal setting, emotional processing, independence, literacy, and more. Playing in band allows students to be a part of a team, which builds social skills, fosters friendships, and builds confidence. Band is a supportive, accepting community, which is why we are known as the "band fam"!

What do we even do in band?

In a regular band class, we get our instruments out, make music together, and play games that help us learn about music history, music theory, the creative process, and more! We are always working as a team, supporting each other, and having a *lot* of fun along the way!

Tell me about concerts and trips!

There are lots of opportunities unique to band that students get to participate in! We have two band concerts a year (winter and spring) that all students are a part of. This is a fun opportunity for us to share our learning and put on a show! In Grade 7 we go to band camp for two days, and in Grade 8 we go on a band trip! This year we are headed to Minneapolis! All students will also get the chance to participate in the Winnipeg Band Festivals that take place in the spring. If you want to have even more time in music, we also have four extracurricular groups that you can join: Choir, Percussion (Drumming) Ensemble, Jazz Band, and Jazz Combo!

I don't have time to join band. It means lots of homework, right?

Participating in band does *not* mean more homework! Students who are busy with extracurriculars outside of school should not worry about not having enough time for band.

I don't have the money to join band. It must be expensive, right?

Participating in band is something we can make happen for *all students* regardless of financial situations. Those able to rent instruments privately will likely pay between \$14 and \$30 a month (\$140-\$300 per school year) to rent an instrument from a local music store. We can also arrange for instrument rentals free of charge for anyone who needs it. When it comes to any other band fees, band trips fees, etc. there will always be fundraising opportunities and additional financial assistance offered. *No one should be deterred from band because of financial struggles*.

How do I pick my instrument?

We will choose our instruments in September! Students will have the opportunity to test the different instruments and learn about them before making any decisions. Ms. Hodge will help guide students when picking their instrument, though it is *always* up to the student which instrument they want to play!
