## Introduction

This handbook was designed to help you, a graduating student from Collège Miles Macdonell Collegiate, access scholarships and awards to help you finance your education and life after high school. Post-secondary education is expensive and scholarships are a way to ease that financial burden.

The awards listed in this handbook are school-based, meaning that the CMMC Scholarship Committee, which is comprised of CMMC staff members, will select or nominate a recipient (unless otherwise indicated). **These scholarships will require an CMMC INTERNAL SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION to be submitted by the student to be considered for selection.**

INTERNAL applications will be submitted via a Microsoft Form. On this application, you will select specific awards and share your involvement and achievement as a Buckeye and in the community, including academics, extracurriculars, community service and volunteerism.

This handbook is a comprehensive list of *school-based* awards. There are many other scholarships and bursaries available. Every year, money goes unclaimed, so check the scholarship bulletins regularly, and do your own research. Happy applying and good luck!

## **Governor General's Academic Medal**

The Governor General's Award at the secondary school level is a bronze medal and is awarded to the student(s) who achieves the highest academic average upon graduation.

The average includes all grade 11 and grade 12 courses. The average is calculated based on final grades after final assessments. All students are eligible for consideration regardless of the stream or the subjects chosen.

*\* Please note that the term **post-secondary education/institution** refers to universities, colleges, polytechnics, institutes of technology, apprenticeship trades and other accredited learning institutions.*

*\* Please note that some scholarships may not be available for the current academic year or amount may change.*

### Acacia Masonic Lodge Scholarship

**Criteria:**

- Attending a university, college, or technical institute
- Must be of good character, with strong morals and ethics
- Committed to helping others
- In need of financial assistance
- Not receiving any other awards

### Andrew Micklefield MLA's Award

This award is generously given by the MLA for Rossmere. Mr. Micklefield seeks to honour a graduate who has worked hard to overcome life's challenges to fulfil their potential.

**Award Amount:** \$300

**Criteria:**

- Has shown courage and resolve in the face of significant challenges during their high school career
- Has displayed perseverance and dedication in achieving success

### Canadian Band Director's Association Award

This is a Canadian National Award to recognize music students for their outstanding musicianship, loyalty, dependability, and leadership. It is awarded to students who, in the opinion of their director, do significant work around Instrumental Music.

**Award Amount:** \$100 gift certificate

**Criteria:**

- Exhibits outstanding musicianship and leadership
- Displays a committed and responsible attitude
- Puts forth extra effort in the area of instrumental music

## **Geoff and Regan Archambault Scholarship (via The Winnipeg Foundation #3794)**

The Archambaults generously give this scholarship to a graduate who is committed to making a difference through community service. They want to acknowledge the positive work done to improve our community and encourage future volunteerism.

**Award Amount:** \$500

**Criteria:**

- Well-rounded
- Has given back to our community through volunteerism, raising funds and/or gathering items to be given to those in need



### **Glenn “Keeper” McWhinney Scholarship (via The Winnipeg Foundation #2733)**

This memorial award is given in honour of Mr. Glenn “Keeper” McWhinney. It is given to a student who embodies the attributes demonstrated by Mr. McWhinney during his lifetime.

**Award Amount:** \$1300

**Criteria:**

- Dedication and commitment to a field of interest
- Demonstrates honesty, humour, humility, and courage
- Must have a record of service to the community through volunteerism
- Consideration is given to a student who has overcome hardships or challenges in or to reach goals.

### **Good Neighbours Active Living Centre Award**

Good Neighbours Active Living Centre want to acknowledge a graduate who embodies their mission of enhancing the quality of life of others.

**Award Amount:** \$500

**Criteria:**

- Committed to volunteer service in the local community

### **Izumi Family Scholarship (via The Winnipeg Foundation #2783)**

This memorial award was established to honour the Izumi family who were long-time residents of East Kildonan. As immigrants to Canada, they persevered through the challenges of immigrating to this country and endured the forced relocation of Japanese- Canadians during WWII.

**Award Amount:** \$1,500

**Criteria:**

- Began Canadian academic life in the English as an Additional Language program
- Demonstrates perseverance, tenacity, and commitment to their academic success
- Demonstrates a commitment to their education through their progress from EAL student to CMMC graduate
- Commitment is reflected by the improvement of academic marks from their entry as an EAL student to their graduation
- Pursuing post-secondary studies
- Must have Refugee Status or be a Permanent Resident, Landed Immigrant or Canadian citizen

### **Jack Stewart and Stuart Pateman Scholarship (presented by the Winnipeg Y Service Club)**

This award is named in honour of the original founders of the Winnipeg Y Service Club whose mission is to support the local community. It is generously given annually in the spirit of helping a graduating student pursue their academic goals.

**Award Amount:** \$500

**Criteria:**

- Hard-working
- Not necessarily top academic student
- Has shown a long-standing commitment to volunteer work in school and/or community
- Must be accepted to a post-secondary institution

### **Kathleen and Bill Douglas Memorial Scholarship**

This memorial award has been established by the family of Kathleen and Bill Douglas. It is supported by the generous donations of family and friends.

**Award Amount:** \$1000

**Criteria:**

- Enrolled at the University of Manitoba
- Not necessarily the highest marks, but values academics
- Has made positive contributions to the culture of the school
- In need of financial assistance

**Award Amount:** \$750

**Criteria:**

- Commitment to volunteer work that improves the lives of those less fortunate
- Pattern of selflessness
- No mark below 65%

### **The Most Improved Student Award**

**Award Amount:** \$750

**Criteria:**

- Significant improvement in two of the following:
  - o Attendance
  - o Academic performance
  - o Cooperation with school expectations
  - o Contributions to extra-curriculars

### **The Robert Fraser Leadership Award**

**Award Amount:** \$750

**Criteria:**

- Commitment to improving school spirit
- Takes initiative in planning and implementing school activities
- Volunteerism both in and outside of school

## **RETSD School Board Medal Award**

The purpose of these awards is to acknowledge the overall outstanding achievements of graduating students in the River East Transcona School Division.

Note: The CMMC selection committee will send one representative to be interviewed by the divisional selection committee comprised of three trustees, the Superintendent, and an Assistant Superintendent.

One student of the six high schools will receive the Gold Medal, and the other five students will receive a Silver Medal.

**Award Amount:** Silver Medal - \$1500, Gold Medal - \$2,500

### **Criteria:**

- Academic excellence, an average of 85% or higher
- Leadership
- Contribution to school and community
- Positive relationship with staff and students
- Personal interview with nomination committee

- Receiving no other award valued over \$1000



## **Rotary Club of Winnipeg East AM Canada 150 Scholarship (via The Winnipeg Foundation #3732)**

**Award Amount:** \$500

**Criteria:**

- Must reside in the River East Transcona School Division west of Lagimodière Blvd.
- Enrolled at an accredited post-secondary institution

## **Royal Canadian Legion Bursary sponsored by Prince Edward Branch #81**

- Exhibited courage, determination, dedication, competitive drive, and the willingness to sacrifice the little things for the things that are worthwhile

## **Terrence Gillis Memorial Award**

This memorial award was established by Mr. and Mrs. Cecil Gillis in memory of their son, Terry, who attended CMMC as a student. Terry is well remembered as a Science teacher at Valley Gardens Junior High School.

**Award Amount:** \$500

**Criteria:**

- Demonstrated proficiency in the area of science
- Strong academic standing
- Committed to volunteering in the school and in the community
- Must have displayed exceptional strength of character
- Pursuing post-secondary studies

## University of Manitoba Chown Centennial Scholarship

This scholarship, in memory of Mr. Charles Gray Chown, is offered to an outstanding student in each high school in the province who is intending to study at the University of Manitoba.

**Award Amount:** \$1000

**Criteria:**

- Must attend the University of Manitoba as a full-time student
- Best “all-around” graduate
- Must have a Grade 12 minimum average of 85% or greater in courses which meet admissions criteria

## Western Inspirational Bursary Award sponsored by Western Financial Group Communities Foundation

The Western Financial Group office in Kildonan Green generously support a graduating student who has demonstrated exceptional qualities and intends to seek further training to become a productive citizen.

**Award Amount:** \$750

**Criteria:**

- Intends to seek further training or education
- Financial need
- Has:
  - o Displayed outstanding community and/or school spirit as an organizer, participant, or volunteer **and/or**
  - o Demonstrated inspiration conduct, whether an act of heroism or leadership in a crisis **and/or**
  - o Has overcome adversity (mental/physical disability, financial hardship, family difficulties)

*A **deserving special needs student** may also apply for this award to recognize their efforts and determination to meet life’s challenges. Such a student may be unable to take post-secondary but may benefit from receiving a cash award to help pay for life-improving equipment, training, or supplies.*
