#### Principal's Message

#### **DEN Advisors**

#### **Student Fees**

All students are to bring **\$50.00** for their student fee on the first day of school. Fees can be paid by cash or cheque. Please make the cheque payable to River East Collegiate. Online payment is <u>not</u> available this year. Fees must be paid in order to remain a Student in Good Standing.

Graduating Grade 12 and S5 students will be required to pay a **\$40.00 Grad fee** at the start of Semester 2

An Art Fee of **\$25.00** is required for all Visual Arts students.

**BASIC SUPPLIES REQUIRED**: binders, loose-leaf paper, pens, and pencils. Information concerning other supplies needed will be shared on the first day of classes by the subject teachers. Students registered in Mathematics Intro to Applied and Pre-calculus 20S are encouraged to have a TI-84 Graphing Calculator; all other math students should have a scientific calculator. Pre-calculus students should also purchase their own graph paper.

#### Timetable

The timetable emailed to parents on Monday, August 18 (also available on the parent portal) shows the name of your DEN Advisor, the courses for which you registered, the names of your subject teachers, and the time slots for each course. Please be advised that some of the courses listed in the registration booklet may have been cancelled due to insufficient enrollment. School hours are 8:23 a.m. - 3:02 p.m.

River East Collegiate is an open campus. Students who are not scheduled for a class may leave the grounds; however, students are encouraged to make use of school facilities (cafeteria, library) during their lunch period and any unscheduled time in their timetable.

**NOTE:** When reading the timetable sent to you and/or found in the Parent Portal, the first 2 columns (Day 1, Day 2) are Semester 1 classes. The last 2 columns (Rotation 2 Day 1, Rotation 2 Day 2) are Semester 2 classes. Students will be receiving a hard copy of their PowerSchool timetable in Den on the first day of classes.

<u>PARENTS/STUDENTS</u>: Please check your timetable carefully to ensure that you are registered for all courses and that you have a <u>BALANCED TIMETABLE</u>. A balanced timetable usually means four courses each semester with a balance between required and optional courses.

PLEASE NOTE: <u>School Counsellors will be available to make timetable changes prior to the start of the school year</u> (August 26<sup>th</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup>, 28<sup>th</sup>, 29<sup>th</sup>) ONLY for students who meet the following criteria:

- (1) insufficient number of credits for graduation (for graduating students only)
- (2) needs arising due to a loss of a credit or failure
- (3) needs arising due to post-secondary plans
- (4) selected course does not appear on schedule
- (5) unbalanced timetable

Contact the office if requiring a timetable change based on the above criteria.

Due to the complexities of timetabling, we may not be able to accommodate your request and we will **NOT** change timetables to accommodate spare, course section (period), teacher or peer preferences.

#### **Attendance Policy**

- 1. Students are expected to be on time and to attend DEN meetings and all classes for which they are registered. School starts at 8:23 a.m.
- 2. Students engaged in a sanctioned school-sponsored activity will be marked "excused absence".
- 3. Medical, dental, or other appointments should be scheduled outside the student's classtime whenever possible. Vacations should be confined to school holidays.

Further information about River East Collegiate's guidelines and supports for attendance will be provided. (See attached document.)

**18-Year-Old Students:** Students reaching the age of majority during the school year **MUST** provide written consent to the office to allow us to continue to contact parents. Forms will be sent home the first week of the month of their birthday.

#### **Computer and Media Release Policies**

RETSD has two policies regarding instructional technology <u>Policy IJND</u>, and <u>Policy Form IJND-E1</u> and media coverage, copyright permission <u>Policy KDDB</u> and <u>Policy Form KDDB-E1</u>. Parents/guardians are assumed to be in agreement of both of these policies; forms to "opt out" of either the use of instructional technology or media coverage and copyright permission please click on the links above to obtain the forms. Please fill out the form, sign and returned to the school if this is not the case.

#### **School Bus Transportation**

School bus transportation is available for students outside city limits only. School buses depart from the east side of the school at 3:10 p.m. for students outside city limits. Contact the Transportation Department for more information (204.669.0202).

#### **School Pictures**

Professional photographers will take school pictures in the second week of school, September 8 (Grades 9 & 10) and September 9 (Grades 11 & 12). <u>All students</u> will have their pictures taken at this time for the yearbook and for a student transit I.D. card (as per divisional policy JRD). This card is required for Library and Internet access and there is no fee for this service. If you wish to purchase photo packages you must pay for them at the time the photographs are taken.

#### **River East Collegiate Parking**

A limited number of student parking spaces are available through a lottery process at the start of the school year. All students submitting their names for a student parking spot will be required to show a valid driver's license. Parking spots obtained through the lottery are non-transferable. Please note that no student may park elsewhere on REC property (no parking in staff spots/visitor spots/turnaround loop/etc.). Unauthorized parking on Chief Peguis grounds is also prohibited. **Offenders will be towed away from these locations at the owner's expense.** Only students with a valid student parking pass may park in the designated student parking lot. Students pay annual parking fees. Any student who brings a car to school is expected to drive in a safe and responsible manner. Failure to do so will result in suspension of parking privileges. The parking fee for the 2024-25 school year **was** \$220.00; this is subject to change for the 2025-26 school year and will be shared prior to committing to a parking spot. Parking fees must be paid by cash or cheque.

Ballots for the student parking lottery will be available from the office at the beginning of the school year (please listen for announcements). STUDENTS ARE NOT TO PARK IN THE STAFF PARKING or VISITOR PARKING LOT AT ANY TIME. Parking passes change from year to year. Students must hand in the previous year's pass to apply for parking privileges.

#### Participation in Hazing or "Freshie" Activities

The participation of students in any hazing or "freshie" activities is strictly prohibited by River East Transcona School Division.

At River East Collegiate we believe that students should always respect and support the safety, worth, and dignity of themselves and of others. The vast majority of our students understand, accept, and overwhelmingly support this belief. Hazing and freshie activities do not comply with this expectation and cannot be tolerated even in moderation. This also refers to activities that may occur after school hours and away from the school. While this has not been a problem at River East in recent years, we want to ensure that it does not occur at all, and we want to make our position clear to everyone.

Any REC student who participates in any activity of this sort will be suspended from school. Any offending student who wishes to be reinstated into REC will be required to attend a re-entry meeting with his/her parents to be held at the RETSD Administration Office. We encourage our students and parents to support the school's position on this matter and to inform us of any infraction.

#### **Extra-Curriculars**

The school offers a variety of extra-curricular activities, sponsored and supervised by volunteer staff members. Early in September students will have the opportunity to sign up for the activities of their choice and participate in intramurals. Students are encouraged to pay attention to daily morning announcements throughout the year.

#### **Sports Teams**

The school offers an outstanding arrangement of sports that are sponsored, supervised, and coached by volunteer staff members. Early in September students will have the opportunity to sign up for the activities of their choice or to try out for the interschool teams. Students are encouraged to pay attention to daily morning announcements throughout the year.



Dear Families of River East Collegiate,

As we begin a new school year, we want to again highlight what we are doing as a school to support increased student attendance, which continues to be a main priority at REC. Research continues to show the importance of student attendance in relation to academic performance, student engagement, social and emotional learning, and teacher effectiveness.

Students who attend school regularly are more engaged in learning, have a greater opportunity to access school and community resources, have a greater sense of belonging, and are more likely to reach their full potential. Student presence and engagement is required for success. Student absence is a serious impediment to a student's educational performance and well-being. Absenteeism can have lasting negative impacts on student achievement, graduation rates, transition to post-secondary education, employment, and social inclusion, as well as on the community at large (taken from A Policy Directive and Action Plan to Enhance Student PRESENCE AND ENGAGEMENT, 2023).

Attending classes regularly is critical for teachers to create a positive feedback loop that allows the collection of a triangulation of learning evidence, which includes student conversations, observations and products.

In the past, schools relied heavily on test and exam scores. Now we know that we need to look at many types of student work. To ensure the evidence of learning is valid (the extent to which the assessment measures what it was supposed to measure) and reliable (students producing the same kind of result at different times), and accounts for different types of learners, three main sources of evidence are considered:

- Observations are records of what the students are doing. Examples include formal/informal oral
  presentations, drama presentations, giving opinions, working with partners/groups and telling
  stories.
- Products are samples of student work. Examples include written tests, diagrams, stories, models and reports.
- Conversations are what students say about their learning, either face-to-face or in writing.
   Examples include class meetings, individual conferences, journal writing, self-assessment discussions and group conferences.

Significant time is spent by classroom teachers, student services and administration to provide tiered interventions to support regular student attendance. Below are some of our Tiered Attendance Interventions that help frame both the importance, urgency, and response cycle connected to improving student attendance at REC. At each of the Universal, Targeted, and Intensive levels some or all of the interventions may be used to support students.
