The Reality

- Since its inception, RETSD has had to deal with an inequitable and inadequate funding formula.
- Previous governments, and now the current government has tried to fix the funding formula with band-aid solutions and grants.
- Government failed to deliver on their promise of a new funding formula.
- RETSD needs to rebuild its surplus (currently 1.9%, recommended 4%) and set aside funds for the new school (including furnishings and technology) and much needed resources and supports for students and staff in the classroom.
- Remedies:
 - An equitable funding formula
 - Properly funded public education
 - Increase education taxes



The Reality

- The Board of Trustees has spoken over the last number of years to MLAs, ministers of education, and our community about the continual and cumulative effects of underfunding and reductions to RETSD.
- RETSD has made several presentations about a new and equitable funding model, but more importantly funding that supports public education.
- Due to the lack of funding and an inequitable funding model, we are expected to do more with less as the student population continues to grow.



Inequitable Impact of Funding on Average Home (2023)

Provincial Funding Announcement

- February 10th, the Province of Manitoba announced education funding for the 2025-26 school year.
- RETSD received an additional \$4.0M for 2025-26 which is half of what we received last year.
- The only significant change to the funding formula is that enrolment is no longer projected it is the best of the last three years.
- The change to enrolment does not benefit school divisions with increasing enrolment, like ours.



Enrolment Comparison

School Division	September 2022	September 2023	September 2024	September 2025
Sample division	10,000	9,700	9,500	9,300
RETSD	17,401	18,276	18,761	19,144

Sample division's funding for September 2025 = 10,000 RETSD's funding for September 2025 = 18,761



Status Quo Budget

- A status quo budget represents the funding that is required to maintain current levels of programs, programming, and services for students and staff based on estimated student enrolment for the 2025-2026 school year. It also includes increases to fixed costs (e.g., such as negotiated salary increases, insurance, utilities, statutory benefits).
- The funding model does not take into consideration the increased costs to cover the status quo budget.
- Government funding does not cover the status quo budget.



Status Quo Budget

The status quo budget includes additional costs for the following:

- Staffing increases for the projected growth.
- Reconfiguration costs to convert spaces to classrooms, including furnishings and technology.
- Additional buses for reconfiguration and to replace buses that are over 15 years old. The cost of a bus has increased to \$225,000.



Beyond the Status Quo Budget

The budget includes the following increases due to expected increased enrolment and expansion of programs:

- An increase in teaching staff of 35.9 FTEs (includes classroom, resource, inclusions teachers, substance use counsellor, teacher librarians and clinicians).
- An increase of over 44 Educational Assistants, including speech language.
- Increased mental health services for students.
- Purchase of 8 buses to accommodate growth and bus replacement.



Budget Highlights

- The 2025-26 budget is \$268.3M.
- The revenue available, including provincial funding, totals \$136.3M.
- The difference of \$131.97M must be raised by increasing taxes to balance the budget.
- Mill rate increase of approximately 5.8%.
- Increase to the average home in RETSD valued at \$360,600 is \$560.80, or \$46.73 monthly.



New Tax Rebate

For 2025, the province announced a new education tax rebate called the Homeowners Affordability Tax Credit (HATC).

- The tax credit is applied directly to the property tax statement up to a maximum of \$1,500.
- The tax credit only applies to a taxpayer's principal residence.

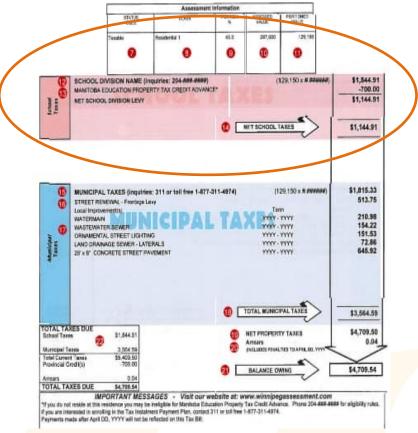

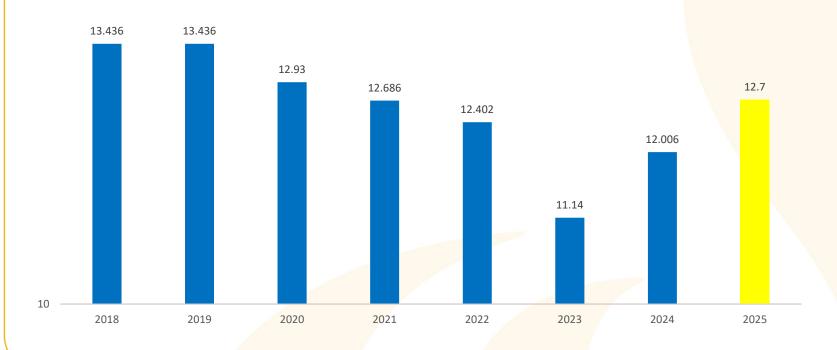

Recap

- The funding formula did not change as we had hoped. It continues to be inequitable. We will continue to advocate for a new equitable funding formula that supports public education.
- The Board of Trustees does not want to cut classroom staffing and resources so the difficult decision was made to increase taxes so that we can maintain and improve services and programs within RETSD.



Budget Considerations

- The RETSD community has identified, through ThoughtExchange, the community forum, and virtual meetings, that they do not want reductions to current programs, programming, and services, but rather a strengthening of what already exists.
- After years of reductions, to reduce RETSD's budget any more would have devastating and permanent impact, including increased class sizes and a reductions in classroom teachers and educational assistants.
