

September at Miles Mac is always a busy month, especially for this year starting in person!!!


For us in the Languages Department, we have a new teacher of Français as part of our French Immersion team: Ms. Chloe Ramm, teaching in grades 9 and 10.

Social Sciences Dept – Remembrance Day Service

On Thursday November 10th the Social Sciences Department organized a very meaningful and engaging program for staff and students to reflect upon the significance of this important day.

Our services were emceed by teachers Kara Street and Gordon Fritzsche and featured a variety of speakers, videos and performances as well as participation by student cadets. Under the direction of Musical Arts teacher Garth Rempel, the CMMC choir and vocal group Compass, provided powerful musical renditions of the songs "Flanders Fields" and "After the War".

The service also included a reading of the poem of "Reply to Flanders Fields" by Dramatic Arts teacher Caitlin Belton's students Amari Juhal and Noah Pastershank.

We were very fortunate to have two current Canadian Armed Forces members speak as part of this event. The commanding officer of The Queen's Own Highlander's of Canada, Lieutenant-Colonel Jon Baker, shared his perspective on the significance of remembrance through the story of a solider from his regiment that was killed in action during the First World War and whose remains were just recently identified in France.

CMMC class of 2021 graduate Private Evan Rollwagen of the 3rd Battalion of the Princess Patricia's Light Infantry shared his message via video as he is currently serving in the United Kingdom helping to train Ukrainian volunteers defending their homeland. Private Rollwagen spoke about Canada's miliary history as well as the significance of the youth passing on the torch of remembrance.

Our hope is that this event encouraged our students to take the time to reflect on the sacrifices that were made and continue to be made to enable us to live in a free and democratic society that values equality and human rights. Lest we forget.

ESD LEADERSHIP TEAM NEWS

ESD (Education for Sustainable Development) News Submitted by the ESD Leadership Team:

The ESD leadership team is excited to share with you a collection of our past and future projects and events that we have planned for the year. All of these projects were chosen with the main goal to support and raise awareness for sustainability in our community. Our "Depave" project brought an outdoor learning space to the school. ESD was able to complete such a project with the help of the school community and various sponsors such as "Depave" Paradise. A portion of the school parking lot was excavated to make room for the learning space, which was then constructed by students and teachers in June of 2022. The project was set to be completed by the fall, with the installation of live edge benches. The space provides students a place to learn, socialize and relax, all while being away from a traditional classroom setting. The project also included the installation of a sharing circle, which has been used for smudges and other ceremonies throughout the year.

This year ESD students volunteered at the Manitoba Social Studies Teacher Association's PD Day held at Miles Mac. Throughout the day we set up classrooms for seminars and helped guide teachers around the school, which in itself was a great volunteering opportunity, and we were also able to chat with some of the people sat at the informative booths setup in our gym. It was a great experience to learn more about some of the groups active in our province as well as a way to start thinking about some exciting ideas for Earth-week workshops to be held in the school. Overall, the experience left the ESD members eager and excited for the activities to come as we continued our year.

ESD, in conjunction with the Social Sciences Department, conducted the municipal student vote at school. This granted students the ability to practice their civil duties of voting and encouraged informed citizenship as information on the various candidates was available to students prior to them casting their vote. Environments similar to real elections were mimicked, which gave students a great overview of how the electoral process in our city works. Additionally, two of our ESD leaders had the opportunity to attend the 2022 Winnipeg Chamber of Commerce-hosted Mayoral debate. Our leaders socialised with other attendees, took pictures with, and had conversations with the candidates, including Scott Gillingham and Glen Murray. They had the opportunity to witness live discussions and debates between each candidate on a wide range of election-related topics, including crime, housing and infrastructure challenges, economic growth, and transportation. They left knowing more about how each candidate intended to improve our wonderful city!

ESD sold pumpkin spice lattes to fundraise for our upcoming projects. The lattes were made from pumpkins grown in CMMC's own garden during the summer. To make the lattes, we roasted our pumpkins in slow cookers, puréed them, mixed in our coffee, and then sold two varieties: vegan and dairy. To lessen the usage of plastic we served it in compostable cups, and also gave the option to bring their own travel mugs. By selling these pumpkin spice lattes, we reduced the amount of carbon emissions emitted by our school's students and staff by ensuring that fewer people drove to or ordered from a coffee shop.

On November 7th, the ESD leadership team attended a Youth Climate Change conference held by Learning for a Sustainable Future at the Canadian Museum for Human Rights. The ultimate goal was to come out of the conference with a new outlook on climate change, hope, and what the youth of today can bring to the table in the future. Our leaders shared some of the projects from the past year and left the conference with ideas to incorporate this year. The speakers from the Prairie Climate Centre were approached with the opportunity of speaking at our school for earth week, and they were more than willing to do so. Attending the conference helped the leaders learn about collaboration, leadership, and thinking creatively to engage the community in education about sustainability.

This club has some very exciting projects planned for this year, ranging from educating peers on the harms of fast-fashion, to bringing in climate experts during earth week. On November 18th, we will hold our own CMMC thrift store/clothing swap where we sell gently-used clothing students at the school have donated! Other projects lined up include selling hot chocolate to raise money for future events, making Christmas tree ornaments with recycled materials, and planning our big earth week line-up of activities. Each year, earth week at CMMC is exciting and has events everyday for students who wish to participate, and this year will be no different. Potential events that are in the making are holding a CMMC fashion show with clothes students have thrifted at the school from our clothing swaps, inviting guest speakers we connected with at the LSF conference, and selling iced coffee with the local women-run business we support each year. Our team hopes that these projects inspire you to think about sustainability in your everyday life and take action to make a difference in your community.
