Get Some Experience

Volunteer, intern, become an apprentice, join a club, try out for a team, or work part-time in your fields of interest! The only way to find out what you are good at is to get out there and try!

Network

Use networking techniques to find out more about work possibilities. Ask people you know about their work or similar lines of work. Ask people you know to refer you to people they know in occupations that interest you.

Conduct Information Interviews

Talk to people about their work. You might consider making some "cold calls" to arrange short meetings with people you've never met but may have the information you need.

Ask yourself the following questions:

- What do people in this line of work do day-to-day?
- What are the usual working conditions (atmosphere, hours, etc.)?
- What are the pros and cons of this work?
- What self-management, transferable, and technical skills are required?
- What type of education or training is required? What training level do most people have?
- Where is the required training offered? How long does it take? How much does it cost?
- Are there additional training/educational opportunities that are not required but may help you succeed in this job?
- Are there any special physical, legal or social requirements?
- What are the future employment prospects? Will this type of work still be needed in 5 years?
- What is the typical salary range for this type of work? Consider salaries for people beginning in the field and for more experienced workers.
- Do you have to belong to a professional association or a union to do this work?









Labour Market Trends

Let's Talk about Labour Market Trends

It is important to have a career that you enjoy, and that coincides with your interests and values as an individual. It is equally important to know what the potential for growth is in your chosen career, and what the outlook for employment opportunities are in your region. Some good questions to consider when looking at different occupations are:

- · Is employment growth expected to be strong?
 - · What do future retirement levels look like? (moderate to high means there will be more job openings!)
 - · What levels of unemployment have been reported recently?
 - · If there is a higher demand for an occupation you wish to pursue in a different region, would you consider moving?

Two helpful categories are "wages", to see how a prospective career generally pays in each province, and "outlook", which considers how many people are retiring and how many new job openings are expected in each field to give you an idea of how likely you are to get hired!

Apprenticeship Manitoba

Why consider becoming an apprentice?

There are over 55 trade programs in Manitoba.

Being an apprentice fast-tracks you into Red River College Polytech

Most trades offer **great salaries**, and you get to **earn while you learn** and begin your post-training life with little to no debt.

If you complete <u>all</u> your training, you will be able to write an exam that certifies you to work anywhere in Canada, called a red seal exam.









Apprenticeship Manitoba

How do you become an apprentice?

You must find a professional in the field you're interested in that is willing to train you. Once you find someone to take you on as an apprentice, you and your employer fill out an application form, which can be found at:

Then you start working, earning money and hours toward your Level 1 certification! Most trades require about 1800 hours of experience per level and have between 2 and 4 levels.



Application Process

Regular Admission

- First come, first served applications are accepted year round
- Apply as soon as early as you are eligible
- You must send in an interim transcript confirming enrollment in the required courses within 15 days of applying
- You must submit a final transcript by July 15th, or the deadline specified in your acceptance letter
- Please note there are some exceptions. Please refer to the RRC Polytech website



Direct Entry vs. Advanced Entry

Direct Entry: For high school applicants coming directly from high school, or applicants with less than one year (24 credit hours) of university studies.

Advanced Entry: Requires one or more year(s) of university-level study to be eligible to apply. Eligibility requirements vary by program.





General Admission Requirements U1

Manitoba high school graduation (5 full credits at the Grade 12 level - S, G, U or C)
A minimum 70% average over the following, with no less than 60% in each course:

English 40 Math 40S 2 - Academic 40S courses

*Limited Admission – Available to Canadian citizens. Avg. 65%, no less than 55% in each course. English 40s, Math 40s, two other 40S Courses

Can I submit more than one application?



University 1 is NOT a wasted year! It is the FIRST year of any degree you are pursuing. You can also apply *after* your first year to any faculty/program as an advanced entry applicant (see specific program requirements)

If you are applying to any direct entry program: If you are not accepted, you will automatically by placed into U1 (no separate application to U1 is required)

If you are interested in 2 or more direct entry programs, you must submit separate applications

APPLY (October to March)

- Have your MET # with you. Can be found on your report card.
- Use PERSONAL email, not your SCHOOL email.
- Self-report grades.
- Pay the application fee and submit.
- Submit supporting documents when requested by the Admissions Office (through the application portal)
- Apply for scholarships and awards (when available)









Self-Reporting Grades

Self-reporting grades is part of the admission process.

- Final Grades marks for completed courses
- **Predicted Grades** marks you believe you will attain by the end of the course (predict based on previous marks or speak to teacher!)









Next Steps

- You will receive an **email** confirming your application was received and is being processed. Be patient! This process can take several weeks depending on when you apply.
- Check the confirmation email you receive after applying for admission to retrieve your **user ID** and **password**
- Log into your **student portal** where you will have access to more information









Transcripts

- Mid-Term & Final marks are submitted to Manitoba universities by our School Division students do not need to submit a transcript (if you apply by the deadline date)
 - April: First Semester final grades & Second Semester mid-term grades
 - <u>June</u>: Final grades
- **IMPORTANT:** Conditional offers and Entrance Scholarship offers are based on April transcript. Final transcript is reviewed to ensure marks are maintained. Scholarship offers may be re-assessed.









Final Steps

- University Prep
 - In May/June the universities will start preparing you for next steps and how to register for courses
- Course registration will take place in July









Acceptance

- You can expect to receive your official admission decision after they receive your interim grades sometime in May or early June (some programs vary)
- Accept Your Offer
 - Accept your offer and claim your entrance scholarship (if applicable) through your student portal

English Language Requirement

For international students and new Canadians:

• University of Manitoba:

1 credit of English 40S > minimum 75% AND 3 years in a Canadian high school with minimum of 5 credits per year to be exempt from writing English Proficiency Test

University of Winnipeg:

1 credit of English 40S > minimum 70% OR 3 years in a Canadian high school to be exempt from writing English Proficiency Test







NOTE

Even if you are not an International student or a New Canadian student, you may receive an email from the university asking for proof of meeting the English requirement. Don't panic! Your transcript will show the length of time you have been in Canada.

Things to Consider

Check admission requirements and deadlines early! Many universities require out-ofprovince students to apply earlier than local students. On average, going to university in another province will cost students \$10,000 - \$20,000 more per year. Often, people wait until their Master's degree (after Bachelor's degree) to study out of province.









- Applying to the **University of British Columbia?** Applicants must fill out a personal profile that outlines their community involvement: <u>Personal Profile</u>
- Applying to any Universities in Ontario (Toronto, York, Waterloo, Western, etc.)?
 - Applications must go through the Ontario Universities Application Centre (OUAC) using form 105 D (ideal completion date of OUAC form: Nov. 1st): Application Guide
 - Many math and science-based programs will require applicants to take Advanced Math Calculus in addition to Pre-Calculus. Check admission requirements early!
- If you are applying to university in the United States you may need to write the SAT or ACT early in your grade 12 year (check with your university of choice, some are no longer requiring entrance exams).









Funding Your Education









4 ways to scholarships . . .

- External Scholarships
 - open to all students, requires searching
- Internal Scholarships
 - open to CMMC students only
- Entrance Scholarships:
 - university based with application
- Application-Based Scholarships:
 - given out by universities & colleges









Scholarships, Awards & Bursaries

How do I find scholarships?

- 1) Make sure you apply to university in time to be eligible for automatic entrance scholarships! Do a thorough search of all the scholarships, awards and bursaries available at the university/college you are planning to attend.

Tips For Applying For Awards, Scholarships & Bursaries

- Get started early.
- Be accurate and complete.
- Be personal and specific.
- Proofread your application.
- Choose your references carefully.
- Give your references time (min. 2 weeks)

- Thank your references!
- Keep your contact information current.
- Check your email account frequently.
- Continue trying.
- Watch for Deadlines!
- Ask for help if needed.

Canada-Manitoba Integrated Student Aid

Manitoba Student Aid administers provincial and federal financial assistance for post-secondary studies in the form of loans, grants and bursaries for eligible applicants.

You can apply for **both** federal & provincial assistance in one application, directly with Manitoba Student Aid.









Benefits of Student Aid

- Not just a loan. There are many **non-repayable** grants & bursaries that they will automatically assess your eligibility for
- 0% interest & interest-free repayment
- No payments required while you are a full-time student
- Repayment assistance available if you are experiencing financial hardships









Eligibility

To be eligible you must:

- Be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident or protected person as defined under Canadian Immigration Legislation
- Demonstrate financial need
- Be enrolled in a degree, diploma or certificate program offered by a designated post-secondary educational institution
- Maintain satisfactory grades









How Much Funding Can I Get?

The amount you can receive depends on several factors, including:

- Your province or territory of residence
- Your family income
- If you have dependents
- Your tuition fees and living expenses
- If you have a disability



FUTURES FORWARD - Tuition Waiver Program

- Ten colleges and universities in Manitoba offer a limited amount of Tuition Waivers for <u>current and former youth-in-care</u>
- Bursary may cover the tuition of a certificate, diploma or undergraduate program
- Tuition Waiver students are also eligible for Living Supports through Workforce Training & Employment (WTE) to sponsor books, supplies and a biweekly living allowance
- Deadline: March 31st

Sponsorship & Government Funding

- Financial sponsorship for eligible <u>Indigenous students</u> may include tuition, fees, mandatory books, supplies and allowance.
- <u>Treaty/Status First Nation students</u> can apply. Students are advised to contact their Education Authority, Band or Tribal Council.
- <u>Inuit students</u> should contact designated organizations or Indigenous Services Canada regional offices to determine eligibility.
- <u>Métis and Non-Status and Inuit students</u> are advised to contact the Manitoba Métis Federation's Métis Employment & Training to check eligibility.
