HOW WE MET OUR GOALS...

- ✓ Our deepened focus on reading and writing strategies have supported student growth across all curricular areas.
- ✓ Our continued work on Sources of Strength, Zones of Regulation, Project 11, mindfulness, outdoor learning and Thrival Kits has resulted in students feeling safer at school and being better prepared to learn.
- ✓ Students celebrated, Black History Month, I Love to Read Month and Kindess Week by participating in events that focused on building literacy skills and developing positive relationships.
- ✓ Truth and Reconciliation was a focus throughout the year, beginning with T&R week in September and carried on throughout the year to June, when we celebrated Indigenous History Month.
- ✓ We continued to procure a wide variety of quality literature that we used to model and support classroom instruction of reading and writing.
- ✓ We added a Pedogogy Support Teacher to our staff who worked collaboratively with all our teachers to enhance teaching practice in the areas of literacy and numeracy.
- ✓ Our EAL Learners were provided with support from an EAL Literacy Support Teacher and Support Worker and as a result the students benefitted greatly.
- ✓ Our Indigenous Literacy Support Teacher and Reading Recovery Teacher helped many of our students to see success in reading and writing.
- ✓ Many students in participated in whole-class IAA teaching and learning activities led by ILST and classroom teachers, authentic reading/writing tasks were included in these lessons.
- ✓ We were able to expand our Early Numeracy Intervention Program by increasing our facilitator's hours so that more students could receive support.
- ✓ Two Teacher Interns were hired. These were teacher candidates that worked with individual and small groups of students to increase literacy and numeracy skills.
- ✓ Hampstead staff continued to focus on best practices in Math learning and spent considerable time implementing new and innovative numeracy strategies in classrooms.
- ✓ Our staff was able to embrace technology in an incredible way enhancing our students digital literacy skills.
