Safety Information

The following processes and procedures are put in place to ensure the safety of our students.

Bus Evacuation Drill

On Monday, September 18th, students in the Ladybug Kindergarten class and all Grade 1-5 students will participate in a bus evacuation drill. The Caterpillar Kindergarten class will participate on Tuesday, September 19th.

COVID MEASURES RECOMMENDED AT THE DATE OF EVACUATION DRILLS WILL BE IN EFFECT

The Public Schools Act, P250-R.M. 465/88 R - Pupil Instruction, states the following:

"The school board shall ensure that at least twice in each school year each pupil is instructed in safe school bus riding practices and participates in emergency school bus evacuation drills which shall be conducted at least once during the fall term and at least once during the spring term of each school year."

The River East Transcona Transportation Department has an excellent safety record.

In maintaining this record, we carry out Bus Evacuation programs in all of our schools in the early fall and late spring of each school year.

These practice drills are carried out so that in the event of an emergency, our students can evacuate the bus as quickly and safely as possible.

The safety of our children is of the utmost importance and must be given first consideration.

Fire Drills

We are required to have 10 fire drills per year. During a fire drill we practice exiting the school in a calm and orderly fashion. As the students and staff exit the building, they line up quietly at the back of the school to await further instructions.



Hold and Secure

Each school is required to have procedures in place to use in situations where there is an unsafe situation in the community and we must lock all the school doors and remain inside the school. This is referred to as a Hold and Secure. We are required to have 2 Hold and Secure practices per year. During a Hold and Secure, all entry doors of the school are locked and monitored. All staff and students must remain inside the school. Noone can enter and no one can leave. There will be no recess or outside classes. While inside the school, everything continues as usual. **The first Hold and Secure practice will be on September 26**th. Prior to the Hold and Secure, teachers will review procedures with the students.

Lockdowns



Each school is required to have procedures in place to use in situations where students need to be kept in a safe location within the school. This is referred to as a lockdown. We are required to have 2 lockdown practices per year. During a lockdown all classroom doors will be closed and locked, and all students are to remain seated quietly out of sight in the classrooms. Students upstairs, in open areas, will be moved to a secure location. The first lockdown practice will be on September 26th. Prior to the lockdown, teachers will review procedures with the students.

Reporting to the Office

Throughout the school day, all doors will remain locked except for the front door. This will ensure that the office staff can see anyone who enters the school throughout the day. Any parent or visitor arriving throughout the day **must report to the office**. If you need to speak with your child or pick them up, the office staff will contact them and have them report to the office to meet you. At dismissal, please meet your children outside at their dismissal door.

Emergency Contact Information

A student data verification form will be sent home with all students on the first day of school. Please be sure to complete the verification form and update all contact information for your child(ren). Additionally, if any of this information changes throughout the school year, please be sure to contact the office to have this information updated. We must have current contact information in case of an emergency.

Indoor AND Outdoor Footwear

Many times during the day as we walk through the school, we will see children choosing to sit on the floor while working on activities. Our floors get very dirty when the students wear the same footwear on the playground and then inside the school. Please make sure that your child has two pair of footwear. One pair is to wear outdoors while on the way to and from school and one pair is to wear while inside the school.



It is essential that the students have a pair of runners to wear in school. Runners allow the students to move safely in all areas of the school as they provide the best traction on the floors and stairs inside the school. It is important for students to change into runners as they enter the building in order to keep our school clean and our students healthy and safe.

Medication

Preferably, parents/guardians should make arrangements with their physician to have prescribed medications administered outside of school hours. When it becomes necessary for a student to take any prescribed medication during school hours, it shall be in accordance with the following procedures:

- Authorization for the Administration of Prescribed Medication to Students (JLCD-E1) shall be completed by the parent/guardian.
- The first dosage of new medication shall not be administered at school.
- Medications must be delivered to the school by the parent/guardian or designated adult in the original pharmacy labeled container It is recommended that this container be a blister pack dispenser.
- Medication shall be sent to the school in the proper dosage. If pills are to be taken in a
 dosage that is less than one pill, they must be cut to the appropriate size before being delivered to
 the school. Liquid medication shall be brought to school accompanied by a measuring device that
 shall provide the exact dosage.
- A one-month supply of medication should be provided to the school when medication is to be given over an extended period of time.
- Only medication prescribed by a doctor can be administered by the school.

Programs and Events

Milk Program

Milk will be available for students beginning on September 12th. Milk tickets can be purchased for \$1.00 each or in multiples of 5 for \$5.00 per milk card. Classroom teachers will collect all milk money.

Picture Day

This year, students' individual pictures will be taken on the fall. Class photos will be taken in the spring.



For all Grade 1 to Grade 5 students, as well as the Ladybug kindergarten class, our fall school picture day will take place on Tuesday, October 10, 2023, Day 1.

Students in the Caterpillar kindergarten class will have their pictures taken on Wednesday, October 11, 2023, at 9:15 a.m.

Our retake day is Wednesday, November 15, 2023, Day 3.

Retakes take place <u>at 9:15 a.m.</u> If your child is in the Caterpillar (even day) kindergarten class and needs a picture retake, please bring them to the school on Wednesday, November 15, 2023, at 9:15 a.m. so they can have their picture taken.

Snack Cart

All students should bring a healthy snack to school for the morning. Some classes may also have snack in the afternoon. Teachers will communicate with parents about snack. Please be sure that students know which food is for snack and which is for lunch. At times, students eat everything in their lunch kit for morning snack, and then have nothing left for lunch.

Snacks will also be available three times a week, on the snack cart, that is put out each Monday, Wednesday, and Friday morning in the hallway at each back entrance. The cart does not provide enough snack for each child, but rather to supplement snack for students who may need something additional that day.

Student Personal Items

Unless requested by a teacher, we ask that students leave all of their personal items at home including toys, fidget tools, Rubik's cubes, playground equipment, etc. If students need fidget tools or any other equipment, the school will provide the required items.



Student Fees

Please remember that student fees can be sent with your child to give to their teacher. Be sure to put the fees in an envelope labelled with the child's first and last name so the fees can be credited to the correct account. Parents can also pay the student fees online through the parent portal. Student fees are \$50.00 for grade 1-5 students and \$30.00 for kindergarten students. If you would like to pay your student fees in installments, please let us know.
