Reminder to Visitors and Parents

Dressing for the Weather

Moving?

If your family is considering or definitely making a move to a new home, please remember to inform the school as soon as possible. It is important to have accurate contact information on file (addresses, phone numbers, e-mail etc.). If you move, please provide new proof of address to the school office to update your information.

School Parking Lot

Please be advised that the parking lot is restricted to daycare, school and divisional staff use from 8:00am – 4:00pm. Parents are encouraged to use the designated pick-up/drop-off route located on Rougeau Ave. Alternatively, there is street parking available around the school. For extenuating circumstances (early pick-up, meetings, etc.), there are a limited number of guest spots available in the parking lot please do not use Bus Loop.

Any spot with a number is an assigned spot. The parking lot is a one-way directional route. Thank you for helping to keep our students safe.

Safe Pick up and Drop of Students

Please remind your child that if they are being picked up or dropped off and need to cross Rougeau, they should be using the one of the crosswalks to cross the street.

With the Drop Zone on the south side of the street and cars passing on the north side it is often difficult for drivers to see people who are crossing between cars. That in combination with icy roads, means we all need to be extra cautious to ensure student safety. We appreciate your help in reviewing these safety procedures with your child. The Drop Zone is for immediate loading and unloading of students, please do not stop and wait in this area.

Lunch Expectations

Please note that we do not have microwaves for students to use at lunch time. Please do not send lunches that need to be heated.

Students should be bringing their own cutlery and water bottles for snack and lunches.

Allergy Alert



In Bernie Wolfe School, we make every effort to protect students with life threatening allergies from exposure to known allergens. In order to minimize the risk of exposure and to ensure the immediate response to an emergency, we provide general awareness regarding life-threatening allergies to their school communities. Per Policy JLCG-R2, school administrators also support the implementation of strategies to reduce the risk for the students with allergies; as such, they notify parents not to send peanuts, peanut butter, peanut oil, nuts, and products containing them to school. Parents are encouraged to help their children understand the seriousness of life-threatening allergies. Individual teachers may send out information regarding specific allergies in their classes so parents can make informed decisions when sending food to school.

Lunch drop off's are NOT encouraged as we are limiting traffic in the building and disruptions to class.

Middle years students

Grade 6 students who stay for lunch must remain on school grounds. All other students are encouraged to stay on school grounds during lunch. Those students in Grade 7 & 8 who choose to leave school grounds and go to community stores are expected to return by 11:55. Students who return to school after that time are expected to wait in the outdoor classroom area until 12:25 and then enter the school and head directly to class.. Students who are choosing to go home for lunch should only return 5 minutes before the afternoon bell.

Party/Class treats

Due to allergies and specific dietary needs, we are not able to facilitate birthday parties or treats being sent with students to class. Please do not send party treats to school to share.

Water Bottles

All students should be bringing a refillable water bottle to school. Bottles can be filled at the filling stations located through out the school.

Mural at the Mall

Our gr.7/8 Art students Mural was displayed at Marshall's department store in Kildonan Place during POW WOW Month from May 22 until June 27.

This mural was created by the grade 7/8 Indigenous and multi-cultural Art students at Bernie Wolfe School, located in the River East Transcona School Division (RETSD). It displays Indigenous culture, with connections to the Seven Sacred Teachings, the Inukshuk, the Northern Lights, the Red River, and finally, to Winnipeg's 150th Anniversary. Our mural is 25 feet long and 8 feet high, created with watercolor on paper. The students spent many hours planning, drawing, painting, and learning about Indigenous culture throughout the process of creating this piece of artwork.


Virtual Reality Activity "Home After War" - Grades 7C & 7D

Since mid-January, our Grade 7 students have been learning about Human Rights which has been integrated into both our Social Studies and English Language programs. To further extend their learning, Ms. Jantz our EAL consultant (English as an Additional Language) was invited into our classes to facilitate a mini workshop called "Forced to Flee" this past March. This workshop provided our students the opportunity to experience what it is like to be a refugee seeking asylum.

In mid-April, Ms. Jantz returned to our classes to offer an additional learning opportunity using Virtual Reality Goggles. "Home After War" is a room-scale, interactive virtual reality experience that takes you to Fallujah, Iraq. The war has ended but the city is still unsafe. There's one looming fear for returning refugees — booby trapped homes and improvised explosive devices (IEDs) in the neighbourhoods. Since the end of the war, thousands of civilians have died or been injured by IEDs. Ahmaied Hamad Khalaf and his family returned home after the fighting subsided. In this experience, the students found themselves in Ahmaied's home, which still shows signs of the damage from the war. Ahmaied takes our students on a tour of his home and explains the challenges of living during conflict.

The VR format can be an excellent way to help students understand some of the realities that people face when they are forced to flee from their homes. All in all, the students from both Grade 7 classes thought this was an engaging learning experience. (See photos below.)

Music Notes - June 2024


Thanks to all the students who created music this year!


