# Administrators' Report

### 1. Staffing:

Mrs Amber Kjernisted currently on medical leave until the end of 1<sup>st</sup> semester. Two substitutes took over the class in the interim. Now hiring for replacement. Half-time Educational Assistant position posted for incoming Level II-funded student now filled by Mme Thérèse Garroni. Additional funding recently granted for another student which may lead to the hiring of an additional half-time E.A. in the p.m.

# 2. Updates:

- AAA school initiative of tipi-building is nearing completion. Spring celebration to be
  planned. Advisors to seek group of dedicated to students to complete the project. CPET
  will continue with Munch Mentoring program in second semester.
- **Capital Projects** submitted to RETSD. Requested work includes motorized bleachers, new carpeting, and denying access to the roof.
- Mantario and Spruce Woods trips Successfully completed.
- Tell Them From Me Survey Completed. Some issues with The Learning Bar getting the
  French survey to operate fully, but they were able to recuperate the data. Collected
  data will be useful along with PICS (Profiling Inclusive Cultures in Schools) data to
  establish direction and priorities for next year's PBIS (Positive Behaviour Intervention
  Support) residency.
- Communication with parents —RETSD has updated their website. Administrators told that parent portal will be next step. Email communication from school (principal) attempted on two occasions. Several 'Message undeliverable' bounce backs but otherwise working. CPET will explore phone dialer with Division. Cost has often been prohibitive, but we do want to re-explore the idea at some point.
