#### 1. Staffing:

and reprise her role as Counselor. Mr. Éric Miron returns to classroom to teach
Biology and Science. Mr. Thomas Lange, a CPET alumnus, teaches English half-time
at CPET in the afternoon, splitting duties at Murdoch MacKay. Mrs. Nancy Kunkel
has begun as half-time clerk.

# 2. Updates:

- AAA school initiative includes a 3-year divisional plan to train designated staff members in various Aboriginal themes. Year 1 includes smudges, tipis, circle work and 7 sacred teachings. AAA Team members will receive professional development over the next three years. CPET will continue with the MUNCH mentorship program.
