1. Staffing:

- Half-time Physics 30S and Biology 30S second semester position filled by M. Guy North.

2. Updates:

- AAA school initiative continues with 2nd year of a 3-year divisional plan to train designated staff members in various Aboriginal themes. Year 2 includes stereotypes, residential schools and reconciliation. 1617 MUNCH mentorship program begins this month. CPET flew the Métis flag on November 16th (to commemorate Louis Riel) and on December 9th (to welcome Mayor Brian Bowman).
