Administrators' Report

May 10, 2017

- Staffing:
 - **1718 sections** determined. Expected similar enrolment next year but five instructional sections lost due to 1617 overstaffing.
 - Congratulations to Mr. Larry Paetkau and Mr. Jean Mousseau who will be retiring at the end of 1617. Mr. Larry Paetkau was also honored with the ÉFM 2016-17 Excellence in Teaching Award after having been nominated by the entire staff.
 - Congratulations to Ms. Michelle Williams who has been transferred to Miles MacDonnell Collegiate as vice-principal for the upcoming year. Ms. Sharla Cockriell, teacher at Miles Mac, will assume the vice-principal position at CPET.
 - Congratulations to Mr. Chris Gusberti who will be resigning from RETSD in 1617 and assuming the role of vice-principal at École Dugald in 1718.
 - Mr. Guy North, Ms. Élise Ahrens-Townsend, and Mr. Robert Grégoire will complete their term assignments in June 1617.
 - Candidate teachers Ms. Chantal Hébert and Ms. Kaitlyn Kellsey hired to teach full time in 1718.
 - Mr. Brad Bamforth and Mr. Éric Miron returning full time to CPET in 1718.
 - 1718 Master schedule completed and will be finalized pending student scheduling in late May.
- Updates:
 - Current enrolment at 358 students.
 - **AAA school initiative** Designated staff have completed three more workshops during this second year of staff professional development.
 - CPET completed MUNCH mentorship program with École Margaret Underhill. This year's theme was the seven sacred teachings. Art Club members also expressed this theme visually and displayed their art at the Divisional Powwow in April.
 - Capital Works and Maintenance Improvement Staffroom renovation was completed this year. New monitor was installed in main hallway to communicate events and announcements and to celebrate achievement in pictures.
 - Upcoming projects include replacing ceiling tiles, putting new flooring in place of old carpets in student services offices and conference room. Also, replacement

of gym doors is long outstanding. We are also requesting reconfigration in multipurpose room near music room to improve flow, supervision and safety.

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PBIS – First year of implementation has been a success and the school community has shown growth over the year as evidenced by the most recent 'Tiered Fidelity Inventory' results which reflect our team progress. A new pilot initiative, which echoes PBIS initiatives in other senior years schools, will evaluate the success of permitting students to don headwear in common areas in the school. It is designed to foster conversation and student voice in determining a suitable dress code that is respectful and appropriate for our school community.
