1. Staffing:

Sharla Cockriell replaces Michelle Williams as vice-principal at CPET. Chantal Hébert
and Kaitlyn Kellsey hired full-time this year after successful student-teaching
practicums at CPET following retirements of Jean Mousseau and Larry Paetkau.
Jordyn McBey hired as replacement for Jeff Beaudin currently on an indefinite
medical leave of absence. Rita Vernaus also currently on medical leave of absence
until October. Eric Miron returns full-time to CPET.

2. Updates:

- AAA school initiative continues with 3rd year of a 3-year divisional plan to train designated staff members in various Aboriginal themes. AAA Team members will receive more professional development, particularly in the area of Truth and Reconciliation. CPET will continue with the MUNCH mentorship program.
- **School building** was updated over the summer. New set of gym exterior gym doors installed. Carpets removed from student services area and rooms 108 and 109 and replaced with tiling.
- Start-up Student schedule changes completed. Student population at 369 students. Establishing a Girls Hockey team and empowering new teachers in physical education and athletics were a first priority. Parent portal access information was redistributed to parents (students) to get more parents logged on to parent portal. As of 2017/09/25, 34% of parents have logged on.
- PBIS program in 2nd year of full implementation this year. Divisional program aligns
 with Safe and Caring Schools priority and aims to improve school climate to foster
 social and academic success in the school. Teacher Advisors continue with planned
 lessons targeting our four goals. Initiative includes bracelet campaign.
- Parent Advisory Council currently sits without a chairperson and executive for 1718. Currently no fundraising mandate. CPET PAC is a member of MAPC in good standing.
