1. Staffing:

 Vivian Aucoin replaces Bénédicte Gonon as grades 11 and 12 French teacher at CPET. Chris Coppinger assumes Biology courses with Eric Miron's departure to école Munroe. Danielle Camara hired as replacement for Jeff Beaudin currently on an indefinite medical leave of absence. Rita Vernaus also currently on medical leave of absence. Mireille Coutu returning from maternity leave in April.

2. Updates:

- AAA now IAA. Divisional Aboriginal Academic Achievement now referred to as Indigenous Academic Achievement. Divisional initiative exists to narrow the achievement gaps between Indigenous and non- Indigenous students. Strategies include inclusion, curricular integration of Indigenous perspectives, mentoring, and professional development.
- **School building** was updated over the summer. Exterior north wall repainted. Ongoing updating to plumbing. Power assist doors in front of building to improve accessibility. New water bottle-filling station finally installed.
- **Start-up** Student schedule changes completed. Student population at 334 students -- down 35 students from last year. Hockey teams must implement new concussion protocols.
- **PBIS program** in 3rd year of full implementation this year. Ms. Zaluski leading the teacher committee. Divisional program aligns with Safe and Caring Schools priority and aims to improve school climate to foster social and academic success in the school. Teacher Advisors continue with planned lessons targeting our four goals.
- Parent Advisory Council currently sits with Ms. Paulicelli as acting chair. New Executive can be determined for 1819. CPET PAC is a member of MAPC in good standing.
- **CPET Apparel** is being centrally coordinated this year through Ms. Cockriell's office.
