Administrators' Report

May 8, 2019

- **Staffing:**
 - **Mme Samara Froese** hired as a casual Educational Assistant until the end of June.
 - **Mme Patricia Friesen** hired as a safety and security monitor until the end of June.
 - **M. Ron Cadieux** has announced his retirement and incoming principal for September is current ERP Principal **Ms. Diana Zozman**.
 - **CPET** will receive a **half-time teacher-librarian** for 1920. Hiring is pending.
 - **Mme Michèle Goulet** will be on maternity leave for the end of this year and the upcoming academic year. Her replacement has yet to be determined for the upcoming year.
 - **Ms. Danielle Camara and Mr. Trent Tuttosi** will complete their term assignments in June 2019. We wish them the very best in their upcoming endeavours.
 - **Mr. Chris Coppinger** appointed vice-principal at École Regent Park for 2019-20. CPET will have to post for a Biology/Science teacher.
 - **Students Services** approved an increase of 1.5 E.A. to 2.0 E.A.s for next year.
- **Updates:**
 - **Current enrolment** at 327 students.
 - **1920 sections** determined. Expected enrolment from 327 to 333 students for September 2019. Enrolment expected to increase steadily over the next few years.
 - **1920 Master schedule** draft is completed and will be finalized pending student scheduling in late May.
 - **IAA school initiative** CPET completed MUNCH mentorship program with École Margaret Underhill. This year's theme was Treaty teachings et la creation of Dream Catchers. Mentorship celebration May 17.
 - **Capital Works and Maintenance Improvement** to focus on improved accessibility in science rooms and to renovate infirmary into a grooming room over the summer.

- **PBIS** – Third year of implementation has been a success and the school community has shown growth over the year as evidenced by the most recent ‘Tiered Fidelity Inventory’ results which have reached 100%.
 - **Divisional and Provincial Concours d’art oratoire**
 - All students in French classes participated.
 - CPET hosted the Divisional Concours d’art oratoire.
 - 8 students represented CPET in RETSD Divisional Concours. (3 students from grades 9-10, 3 from grades 11-12, 2 impromptus)
 - 3 students representing CPET at the Provincial tournament.
 - **Grade 8 visits** – Dugald and Regent Park toured the school on April 29, 2019.
 - **Tri-School Career Fair** was a huge success. We had over 45 presenters and a steady stream of students and parents who attended. Presenters were very impressed with the organization and turnout.
 - **DELf** (Diplôme d’études en langue française) testing was recently administered to participating grade 12 students. Results pending for students receiving their Level B2 designation.
 - Grade 12 **Oral Proficiency Certificates** testing for graduating students who did not participate in the DELF testing are scheduled for later in May. Results pending.
 - **Constable Martin Boileau** presented his online safety seminar to students on May 1st. Topics dealt with the internet and technology, social media, online chatting & predators, uploading & sharing of photographs, cyberbullying & harassment, sharing of intimate images (sexting), possession & distribution of child pornography and teen mental health.
- **Mot juste** – Spring (3rd) edition of our quarterly **newsletter** published in mid April. Summer edition scheduled for end of June.

 - Third official report card posted to parent portal on April 18, 2019.
 - Parent Portal login statistics have dipped from 84% in 1718 to 74% in 1819. 49% of primary contacts logged in since term 3 report cards published.
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 - **Staff Professional Development** –
