PATROL NEWS

Hello family and friends,

As the cold weather approaches, we as a community need to work together to ensure our patrols are kept safe on the streets. As the snow falls and the roads get icy, it will take longer for cars to stop and vehicles may even skid past a crossing or stop sign. Please adjust your speed to match the conditions and take in to account the extra space needed to stop. Snow banks will also accumulate as the snow falls and could block the view of the patrols. It may become difficult to see the patrols and extra caution should be given when driving through our school zone.

For our patrols, appropriate clothing is required to go out on post. As the temperature drops, patrols are required to wear: jackets, ski pants, toques, gloves, neck warmers or scarves and boots. Patrols will not be allowed out on post if they are not dressed according to the weather. Post times will be shortened in the event of extreme weather.



We know that stopping for patrols and slowing down for our students' safety slows down your day. We sincerely appreciate your care and adherence to safety!

Please remember not to park in the back lane by the school.

Please do not stop in the back lane and let your child run across the lane or into the parking lot.

This is a very important safety rule!

Just a short note to update you on Tabs for Wheelchairs. On Oct. 6, all our tabs were picked up at **Access Storage** on Marion St. by **YRC Freight** and brought to **Western Scrap Metals**. Thank you once again to all three of these companies for continuing to partner with us! We would also like to take this opportunity in a very big way, to thank Dave, who used to be the owner of St. Boniface Bag, for donating **2000 bags** to the program just a few months ago. He kept them for us after selling his business in the spring and surprised me with this wonderful gift! **Thank you, Dave!** You were a Godsend to the program and we will be forever grateful! This number of bags will last us for at least five years.

Now, none of this would be possible if it wasn't for each and every one of you! You can all be very proud of what we have accomplished in these last 24 years! At this time, we have presented **52 specialized** wheelchairs, 26 from the tab collection and 26 from monetary donations, which includes two anonymous very generous benefactors.

I would also like to thank all of you who have personally dropped off tabs, cans and metals of various kinds during this last year, to **Western Scrap Metals** in Winnipeg and **Wesman Salvage** in Brandon! Please, never forget to inform both places that your drop-off is to go to Tabs for Wheelchairs, as they will credit our ongoing accounts. Thanks so much to both of these companies for doing this for us!

Trailblazers Life Choices must also be mentioned and recognized as they have been a tremendous asset to us, both in Winnipeg and Steinbach! They do all the final bagging of the tabs and have been a wonderful group to work with! **Both places will be closed for the holidays from Friday, Dec. 23 – Tuesday, Jan. 3.**

NOW TO GET TO THE VERY BEST PART AND SOME ABSOLUTELY WONDERFUL NEWS!!!

Last week, I received a cheque for \$8,500.98 from Western Scrap Metals, plus a \$100 donation. This was for 12,115 lbs. of aluminum tabs and 15,592 lbs. of miscellaneous metals. This is the most we have ever brought in. Last year, we had 8,690 lbs. of aluminum tabs and 2244 lbs. of miscellaneous metals. Wesman Salvage also has given us a total of \$2,583.00 this year. We are definitely just getting better and better!

July 4th, 1942

Dear Dad,

Every time I think of you, I cry on my bed wishing this dreadful Neverending war to stop! I want peace, I want you to come back home! My mom is hugging my sister to stop her sobbing. (BOOM, CRASH, SCREAMING!) When I sleep, I still hear guns shooting, buildings exploding, bodies dropping on the ground, booming and screaming. Please come back for my eleventh birthday, it's in eleven days! Every day our house is crumbling. We only have freedom to get out of our house for a few hours before everyone starts running back in their house. We run back in our basement because it's not safe upstairs anymore. When I come outside there's smoke everywhere! I see blood all over the cracked landscape. There are many destroyed buildings and houses. I was writing this letter in tears. Rest in peace for all the innocent beings and all the soldiers who fought in the war who passed away from this hated war. Please dad, COME BACK SOON!!

Dear Dad,

This is my fourth letter that I'm writing to you. I hope your coming back soon. I'm scared. I hear gunfire and explosions. I want to go outside but I can't. Do you even remember that my birthday is in six days? The only present I want is for you to come back. I want peace not this dad. Dad are you even coming to my birthday? Please tell me. Nav and mom are not good, they miss you a lot. When I look outside, I just see people running, solders fighting and people hiding. If you're not coming back, I will always remember that you fought for the country. Please write back dad please! I just want to lock myself in my room until you come back. Its 9:17 right now. I can't sleep because I hear voices of people screaming and running. I wish you were here so we could play chess or snakes and ladders.

Dear Dad,

I cannot sleep without knowing that you are safe and secure. My best friend helps and understands how sad I am that you are not here with me. She takes my mind off things. Mom, Trent, Ky, and Jai are not doing well without you.

I am writing this letter at 2:42 at the dead of night. The nights are loud, cold, and even worse than at dawn.

My birthday is in two days, I know that you will not make it back by then. I want you to write to back to me to let me know that you are okay.

I want you to know that Trent started the Volley-ball team at his school, and I started the girls team. Our land is falling apart, I do not even want to take one glance outside. Its not safe to go in the basement anymore were upstairs.

Whenever I see your photograph hung on the wall, I imagine what you are going through right now.

When you left for war, I held your picture close to my heart dreaming of the moment you would arrive home to hug me as tight as you can.


STEAM CHALLENGE

RETSD Cold Weather Guidelines

Sometimes, severe weather requires us to make changes to busing, outdoor recess, and safety patrolling to keep your children safe.

Busing

When the temperature or wind chill is -45C or colder at The Forks, metro Winnipeg school divisions (RETSD included) cancel buses for the entire day—but schools usually remain open.

We will post a cancellation alert on the RETSD website home page if buses are cancelled, and alert the media. If we have not posted a cancellation alert by 6:45 a.m., buses are running.

Indoor Recess

When the temperature or wind chill is between -25°C and -27°C, a shortened recess period may be warranted. When it is below -27°C, recess is usually moved indoors. This is at the discretion of the principal.

School Patrols

When the temperature or wind chill is between -27°C and -34°C, patrols will remain on post for 10 minutes. When it is -34°C and below, patrols will remain on post for five minutes. At -40°C and below, no patrols will be on duty.

School Closures

Schools very rarely close due to winter weather.

Winter Clothing

Please ensure that your child comes dressed appropriately for the weather each day. When the temperature or wind chill is between -27°C and -34°C, warm winter clothing is essential, and facial protection is recommended. When it is -34°C and below, facial protection is essential, and it's recommended that children avoid going outdoors unaccompanied—skin will freeze in less than 10 minutes.

If you have any questions not addressed by these guidelines, please contact your child's school.



Take it Slow in Ice & Snow

Winter driving conditions are here, and roads are not always clear!

The snow looks like it's here to stay. Remember roads may be slippery with ice hidden under the new snow. These conditions can make stopping or turning difficult at stops, intersections, and corners, so please be cautious when you see our school buses.

We may be stopping at any moment for children!

Remember—we are carrying precious cargo.

So, please adjust your driving to suit the conditions, especially when you see one of our many buses on your commute—keep your eyes peeled for their stop signs and our students. The piles of snow that line streets can make for tempting hills to climb, so parents, please talk to your children about the danger of slipping into traffic and advise them to stay on the sidewalk.

And drivers, be especially alert when driving near schools. Student safety is all our responsibility. Take it slow, and we will all get to where we need to be, safely.
