Dear Sherwood Families,

It's hard to believe it's already December. It's been a great start to the school year. We have enjoyed getting back into routines, seeing smiling faces (new ones and returning ones), and learning together. Thank you for a wonderful start!

I do want to again highlight to families the importance of not having moving vehicles in the back lane or using the staff parking lot for pick up and drop off. Drills/Practices



Each year we have ten fire drills, one hold and secure drill and two lockdown drills. The fire drills are held throughout the year in order to keep the routines fresh in the students' minds. On average it takes just over 1 minute to evacuate our building. Our lockdown drills are held in the fall and in the spring. We will also have a hold and secure drill which is a practice of what to do in case there is a threat within the community.

Teachers review the procedures with the students so that they are aware of what to do in case of an emergency.

Entrance and Exit Times

We would like to thank our families for bringing their children to school on time and picking up their children promptly at dismissal.

For safety reasons it is very important for students to arrive at school when the patrols are on post. If children are going home for lunch they are expected to remain at home through the lunch hour and then return to school in time for the 1:00 bell. <u>Those students not registered and paying for the</u> <u>Lunch Program cannot come to school</u>. Please note that outdoor supervision begins at 8:55 am. Please do not send children any earlier as there is no supervision prior to that time.

Allergies

Please note that all RETSD schools and properties are peanut and nut free. We ask that all parents refrain from sending items which may contain peanuts, nuts, or nut oils of any kind in lunches or for snacks.

Medication

Authorization for medication forms must be completed every year for students who will carry inhalers or Epipens to school. If you have not completed a form for your child and he/she is carrying prescribed medication please complete a form in the office.

Families are reminded that according to divisional policy, **non-prescription medication cannot be administered by school staff without a doctor's note and a label on the medication indicating dosage specific to the child.** When filling any prescriptions please request that the label be placed on the medication container. The school is not able to administer the first dose of any medication, with the exception of an Epipen.

Please note that medication cannot be transported to and from school with a child and must be signed in and out by a parent or guardian at the office.



For safety reasons the staff parking lot and the front of the school are NO DROP-OFF AREAS FOR STUDENTS from 7:30 a.m.- 4:30 p.m.

As you know, Sherwood School's Lunch Program is a user pay, parent run program, overseen by a parent committee. It is not overseen by the School Division or by School Division staff, however, the principal of the school does work in consultation with the committee. We are very grateful to have a committee at this point and they are working hard to get everything up and running at that level.

The program runs solely on the lunch fees collected from families who use the program. Each month, on the first school day of the month, fees are due for that month. Lunch fees were raised last year to cover the costs of the program, as the program had used up a small surplus that was left in the account to compensate for the shortfall. This raise in fees allows the program to just break even. When fees are not paid on time, there may not be money to pay the supervisors, and there isn't any other revenue to cover this. It is imperative that fees come in, in full, on time, each month, and we thank those families who have made sure to keep their accounts up to date.



The kindergarteners are always happy to be in school. We love listening to and reading books. We read the book "Our Class is a Family." We learned that in our classroom it is safe to be ourselves and it is okay to make mistakes. We also learned how important it is to be a friend to others and always be kind to one another. This helps us build and strengthen our class as a community.

We promised to be safe, respectful and responsible in our classroom and in the school.

It was great to meet with all the grade 1 families at student-led conferences. The students' enthusiasm and confidence while sharing their learning with all of you was fantastic! Your comments, feedback, and support from home were greatly appreciated too.

In other exciting news, in November, the students went on a field trip to the Children's Museum. This was their first time on a school bus and riding the bus was a personal highlight for many of the students! At the museum, the students learned how tipis are built and then explored the museum. Our students were excellent ambassadors for Sherwood School; they demonstrated good listening, manners, and safe behaviour. A huge thank you to the parents who volunteered and helped the students throughout the morning. Their help ensured a successful and memorable trip.







GRADE 2/3 IS HUMMING WITH LEARNING

What a great start our class has had to the new school year! We have spent time settling into our classroom, establishing routines and discussing how we can be safe, respectful and responsible school citizens. We have become a wonderful classroom community full of friendship, fun and learning!

In Math we have done lots of work to continue to develop number sense. We have been composing and decomposing numbers, comparing numbers, skip counting and determining if a number is odd or even. Students have enjoyed sharing their mathematical thinking during our number talk conversations.

In Social studies we have been learning about communities and what makes a community including people, places and landmarks. We have learned about jobs of people in the community and how everyone has rights and responsibilities. Lots of great discussions have been happening.

Students in Room 8 are voracious readers! Every day they spend some time reading to self and reading with a partner. We have talked about picking good fit books, as well as reading strategies for when they come to an unknown or unfamiliar word. We are also talking about long and short vowel sounds to help us with our reading and writing.

The force is with us in science! We have been learning about the forces of gravity and magnetism, as well as position and motion. Students had the opportunity to experiment with magnets and make small cars that moved with wheels and axles. Our design process was a lot of fun! Thank you to all the families that sent in extra materials to help us with this project.

Room 9 has been hard at work these past few months!

In math, we have been learning about increasing patterns and gearing up for addition with regrouping.

We also undertook a big project about Arctic animals. We spent lots of time researching and learning so that we could write an information book and create a habitat diorama.

Ask us about the adaptations our animal has so that it can survive the harsh Arctic winter!











The Fantastic Fives

We had a great start to the school year!

This term, we completed a radial symmetry art project with coloured paper with Miss Schroeder. We learned about radial symmetry and practiced three paper folding techniques to add to our artwork.

In science, we have been learning about simple machines. We built Rube Goldberg machines with a partner and we went on a field trip to the Children's Museum where we continued to learn about simple machines through different activities.

Many of the Grade 5s participated in different clubs. Some students joined Run Club where they went to Bird's Hill Park for the Cross Country Running Meet and/or Volleyball Club where they went to Hampstead School for a volleyball tournament.
