## A message from Mme McKay-Vielfaure's grade 5 class in Room # 18

In Room 18, we put our creativity and reflection skills to work. We wrote resolutions for 2026 in French, thinking about what we want to try, what we hope to improve, and what habits we might want to scale back. We turned our ideas into cozy mugs of "hot chocolate" by writing our goals on paper marshmallows and attaching them to 2D mugs we coloured with different shading techniques and coloured pencils to create depth.

In math, our problem solving conversations have been just as lively. We've been exploring what strong mathematicians do: think flexibly, persevere, and explain our thinking. We used these skills to tackle a mosaic challenge that asked us to determine the total number of square tiles in a displayed design. It has been a creative, thoughtful, and energetic winter in our classroom!



## A message from Mme Koop in our Library Learning Commons



There is always something happening in the library! In our Library Learning Commons program, Room 6 has been writing in French, Rooms 15 and 19 have been researching, Rooms 13 and 14 have been exploring Anishinaabe culture through Minecraft, and Room 9 has been learning about robots and coding. A number of other classes have explored the non-fiction section of the library.



Open library times (grade 2-5), drawing club (grade 1), and MYRCA club (grades 4-5) are ongoing. We also have a wonderful group of student Library Helpers who have been learning to shelve books, keep the library organized, and are beginning to make their own recommendation displays. Students will be learning about early French-Canadian Culture, and the important roles of the Voyageurs in history. During the week students can wear clothing items that were an important part of everyday living for the Voyageurs.

## Positive Behaviour Intervention and Supports (PBIS) Update

**PBIS** is an evidence-based framework that proactively promotes positive behavior and addresses student needs through individualized support. By establishing clear expectations, consistent reinforcement, and data-driven strategies, PBIS empowers school staff to foster environments where students succeed academically and behaviorally.

This year, Neil Campbell is excited to introduce an updated behaviour matrix built around our three simple guiding principles: We are safe, respectful, and responsible. These principles help students understand our expectations and what positive behaviour looks like in all areas of school life—from classrooms and hallways to the playground and bus. Being safe means making choices that protect ourselves and others. Being respectful means treating people, property, and learning spaces with care and kindness. Being responsible means doing our best, following expectations, and taking ownership of our actions. By using this common language across the school, we are helping students build strong habits that support learning, belonging, and success for everyone.
