Calling all Volunteers!

Parking: We have had several instances of unsafe driving around our School Patrols lately, and we'd like to remind everyone of the parking and stopping zones surrounding our school. Please do not stop near our Patrols; doing so makes it unsafe for them and the students they are helping.

Please have a conversation with your child regarding safe pick-up and drop-off zones around our school.

If you are unable to find a safe stopping/parking spot near our school, please continue to circle the block until one becomes available. Alternatively, you may find safe/legal stopping/parking along one of the side streets, or a little farther away.

For the safety of our students and Patrols, please do not park or stop in the restricted parking zones or private driveways around our school.

You can report parking/stopping infractions at: [Report a parking violation \(winnipeg.ca\)](https://www.winnipeg.ca/report-a-parking-violation). This page shows that "No Stopping" along with other infractions can be enforced with a picture, and drivers will have a ticket mailed out to them without even knowing they have incurred a ticket.

The picture highlights the areas (in red) that our Patrols are stationed, as well as multiple no stopping and parking zones. **Please make sure you are paying attention to the City of Winnipeg's signage surrounding our school to avoid getting a parking ticket.**

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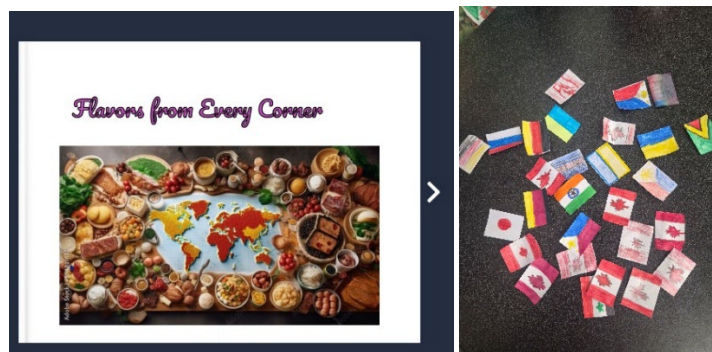
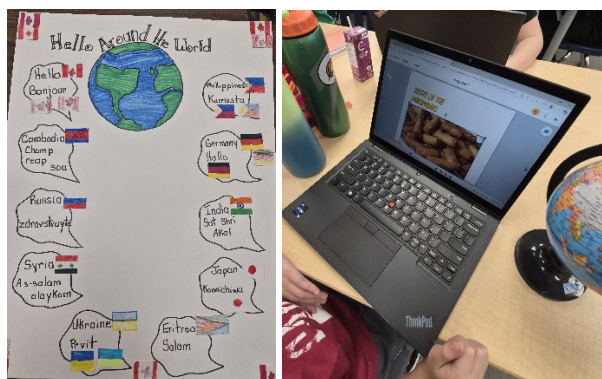
A message from Mrs. Sandhu's grade 2 & 3 classes in Room # 09
