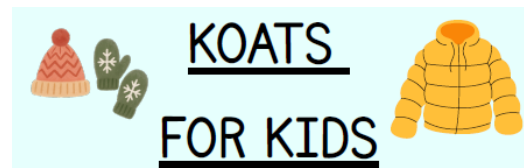

Remembrance Day Assembly

On November 10th, our school community gathered to honour veterans during a meaningful Remembrance Day assembly. Grade 2 and Grade 8 students served as masters of ceremony and facilitated the event in French. We watched a powerful video from veteran Peter Martin, who shared the story of the two Moroz brothers who served in WWII. The Grade 8 band performed music to pay tribute to veterans, and two students played *The Last Post* on the trumpet, creating a moving moment of reflection.

Our Grade 6 students also participated in the No Stone Left Alone ceremony where they went to Transcona cemetery, along with other Transcona schools, to place a poppy on the graves of veterans. It was a powerful and touching ceremony that will leave a lasting impression on students.

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Sources of Strength – Peer Leader Training

Several Grade 6, 7, and 8 students recently completed *Sources of Strength* training to become Peer Leaders. Through this program, they learned strategies to promote hope, help, and strength within our school community. These student leaders will work together to plan initiatives throughout the year that support mental health and well-being for all students.





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School Plan 2025-2026 – Impact on student learning

Throughout the year, as teachers collect evidence of student learning through observations, conversations and products, we are also collecting evidence for our school plan on the impact of our school's collective actions on student learning related to our three priorities:

Literacy:

By June 2026, all students in ERP will become increasingly literate citizens who use language to communicate, comprehend, and think critically. This will be reflected through multiple modalities (e.g. print, digital, oral) and that are drawn from multiple data sources (e.g. products, observations, conversations) that are student-specific, strength-based, and ensure learning acceleration and evidence of growth over time.

Numeracy:

By June 2026, students in ERP will develop confidence and skill in using math accurately and efficiently. Their progress will be shown through different areas of math and measured using a variety of student-centered, strength-based tools such as their work, teacher observations, and conversations, showing growth and learning over time.

Comprehensive School Health:

By June 2026, all students at ERP will demonstrate measurable growth as safe, caring, and empathetic citizens by engaging in collaborative, cross-curricular learning experiences that foster empathy, a sense of belonging, respect, and responsibility.

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This image showcases Grade 8 students' shared interests, fostering connections among them and contributing to their overall well-being. Also, reading students' reasons for why studying history matters—shared from their own perspective—offers a great example of how they communicate critical thinking

Zones of Regulation in Grade 2: Students select strategies for each zone, focusing on identifying emotions, using tools to support emotional regulation, and building empathy for others
