Principal's Message

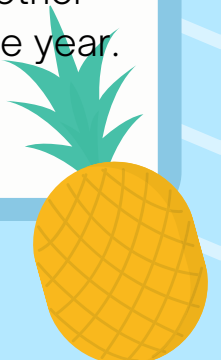

4ième Année - Grade 4

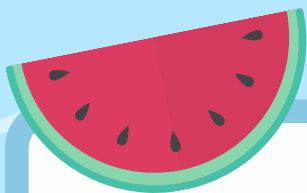

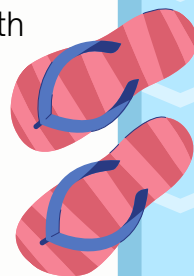


5ième Année - Grade 5

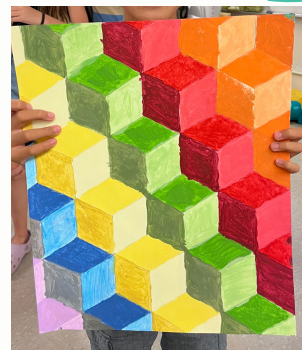
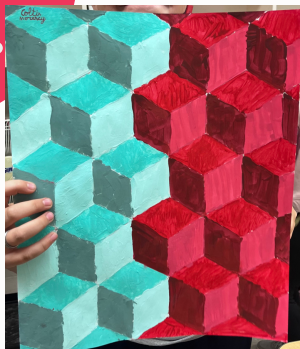


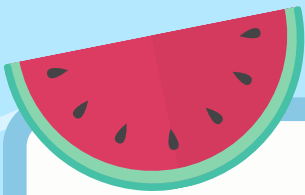

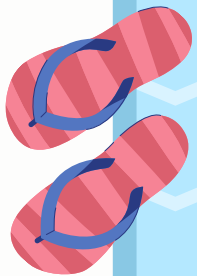


3D art compositions exploring colour and value with acrylic paint. Students created these optical illusions themselves using only hexagon tracers! 5B



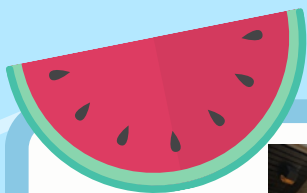


6ième Année - Grade 6

7ième Année - Grade 7

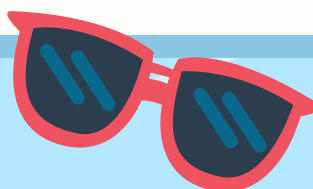


Grade 7 News at ERP!

The students and teachers in grade 7 have been busy with year-end projects such as designing, building and testing solar ovens and creating prototypes of coolers to reduce the transfer of heat.

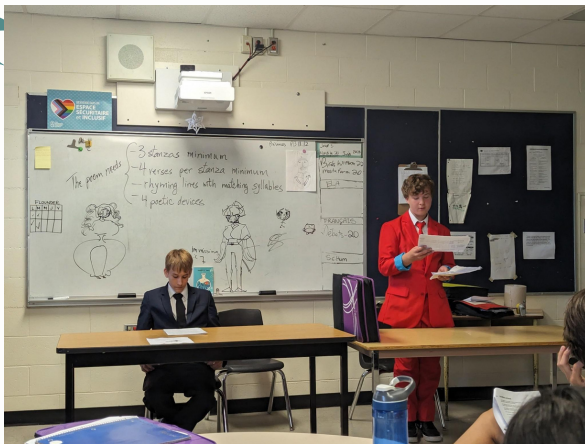

Students participated in project-based learning where they were required to research new design methods for Adobe Photoshop, teach it to themselves, and submit a final piece. Some of them were truly excellent!

From 3D printing to coding we covered a lot of different subject areas within the Mac Lab this year. Don't forget – Scratch & TinkerCAD is free software that can be accessed from home! Try some coding and 3D modeling on a rainy day this summer!





Drama



All Grade 7 students should be extremely proud of their excellent work in drama class this year; we look forward to seeing you all in Grade 8!

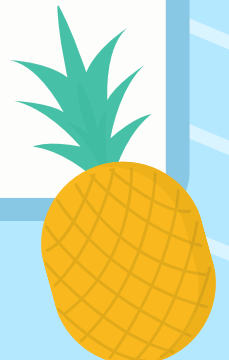






Music and Band News

Level One Festival:






Grade 7 & 8 Class Trip Fundraiser

For only \$25, you will have endless savings with the Show & Save Coupon Book.

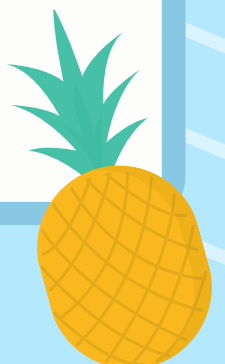


By purchasing your Show & Save from us, you will be working to offset the cost of our child's outings – 100% of the profits of this fundraiser go towards student's trip costs.

2022-2023 Three Priorities

1. Students will have a sense of attachment in a positive and safe environment that respects diversity, equity, sustainability and inclusivity. All students participated in establishing a safe and inclusive school environment, while promoting cultural awareness and respecting the values and traditions of others. All expectations fit within the school's mission of Excellence, Responsibility, Participation and Service. Teachers worked continuously to build relationships with students to further establish a culture of respect and caring. Student participation was in full force this year with clubs, sports, field trips, band outings, concerts, musicals, guest speakers and collaborators. To further connections and demonstrate responsibility and service, students were invited to participate in a variety of community projects: Collections for Winnipeg Harvest, Transcona food bank, Siloam Mission, Take Pride Winnipeg, Ukraine fundraisers and the Terry Fox Foundation amongst others. ERP continues to be the site of growth and change, as construction of the new gym and classrooms is taking shape, and the Parent Advisory Council has completed their fundraising for the new playground, with installation slated for August. Students demonstrated environmental responsibility and promoted spending time outdoors through the ERP greening initiative with the installation of 4 new garden boxes. All students took time this year to recognize and pay tribute to the children lost in the Residential school system, exploring the Truth and Reconciliation Calls to Action and participating in a variety of activities recognizing National Indigenous Day. Staff and students heard from several elders and Indigenous knowledge keepers, while also having the opportunity to explore a room sized map outlining the history of the Indigenous Peoples of Canada. Staff and families celebrated student successes and learning during our community BBQ and student Expo.

2. Students will express themselves and actively interact with their immersive French environment by demonstrating growth in their ability, ease, and frequency to use the French language.

All students at ERP increased and strengthened their reading fluency, comprehension and critical analysis of texts in both languages. Teachers continued their professional learning with a book study of Schools That Matter, as they worked to connect their practices to focus on the whole student—Mind, body, Emotions and Spirit. All students continued to grow their inquiry skills through a variety of in class projects. Professional development was continued around engaging ways to promote the French language through games and student centered activities. Students shared some of this learning exploration at the March Student Expo. Students were provided extra reading and comprehension support with 2 literacy support workers this year. Rich literature was purchased for all classroom libraries focussing on diversity, equity, culture and gender identity.

3. Students will become independent, confident, accurate and efficient sense makers in math.

All students at ERP continued to increase and strengthen their collaboration and problem solving strategies in Mathématiques. Students worked through real world math problems as they connected to other curricular areas. They worked to find solutions to problems and think critically and collaborate with others. ERP hosted professional development math sessions for teachers to explore problem solving and math instruction strategies. Cross curricular inquiry projects and virtual platforms provided students with the opportunity to think critically, and problem solve together. Teachers continued to work on building student confidence through the development of a growth mindset as they work on a positive, authentic approach to Numeracy.

ERP Highlights 2022-2023

- ♦ School wide preparation of Red Dresses (recognizing Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Children). Reconciliation ceremony, welcomed Elders and Indigenous Knowledge Keepers.
- ♦ Student choice days : Wellness day and activities recognizing National Indigenous Day
- ♦ Building of 4 new garden boxes and planting in existing gardens around the school to link to curricular objectives
- ♦ Grade 8 student leadership. Student service to others including events at EC and EMU.
- ♦ Outdoor Jazz Cabaret
- ♦ Year-end out of school celebrations at each grade level
- ♦ Construction of the new gymnasium and classrooms is taking shape!



Closing Remarks

We started up in September with a focus on connecting our staff and students in working with teachers in getting to know each of their students strengths and interests. We continued to connect with school wide assemblies and a large variety of activities that promote connections, relationship building and creating a sense of belonging. Student mental health has continued to be a primary focus of teachers to ensure everyone feels safe and welcome. We continue to focus on curriculum objectives in an enriching environment while promoting our school motto which is based on the Circle of Courage: Excellence (Mastery), Responsibility (Independence), Participation (Belonging) and Service (Generosity).

We continue to see a lot of physical change in our building as we anxiously await the completion of the new gymnasium, band room, home ec room and new classrooms. The phys ed staff continue to be ultra flexible as they adapted to the loss of storage and teaching spaces have shifted outdoors once again. We could not be prouder of our students and staff for their dedication and tireless efforts through the year as we continue to shift according to the spaces that are available. Through an exhausting fundraising effort, the ERP PAC was able to raise enough funds to purchase a playstructure, which is slated for installation this August! Our ERP staff is an amazing collection of educators who are energetic, passionate and committed to the endless possibilities for growth and learning. We would also like to acknowledge all our ERP families and PAC for their constant support and contributions. 




