

We are learning about simple machines in Science in Ms. Soroko's Grade 5 classroom. We will be learning over the next month about six different simple machines. The students then had an hour to create a catapult that would launch a marshmallow 30 cm. If the design didn't work, students went back to the drawing board to improve their design. 2018-19 Registration

Registrations for Grade 5 students going into Grade 6 were sent home the week of February 5th and are due back to school by Friday, February 23rd.

Registration for the 2018-19 school year begins Monday, March 5, 2018 for in-division students. If you will be registering a new student for Kindergarten, please be prepared with your child's birth certificate as well as two pieces of ID with your current address; this may include driver's license, Manitoba Medical, offer to purchase, rental agreement, or any utility bill.

If you would like to register a student and you reside outside of the RETSD divisional boundaries, registration begins Tuesday, May 1st.

Westview's New Murals

In January, students at Westview school were involved in an 'Artist in the School' residency program. All the students in Westview worked alongside artist Annie Bergen to create two murals. One will be displayed at the entrance of the building while the other will be displayed in the library. The theme of the mural was 'Community' and students first worked in their classrooms exploring what community means to them. From there, students were asked to create their own individual works of art and submit it to the artist. Ms. Bergen then took all of the individual works of art and, working together with groups of students from Grades 3-5, they compiled the pictures and found common elements. Once this was done it was time to paint. The Kindergarten and Grade 1 classes started the project by painting the background colours. From there students started to add the details. Once it was completed, students were asked to add a decoupage element to the mural to add greater detail. In the end, the students did an amazing job and the mural they created will be a welcome addition to the school. Cold Weather Guidelines

Periodically, guidelines are requested by schools regarding when students should remain indoors during extremely cold weather. The following guidelines have been developed to assist schools in making these decisions.

- -17°C to -25°C: Normal winter clothing generally adequate. Pleasant conditions for most outdoor activities cease.
- -25°C to -27°C: Warm winter clothing recommended. Most outdoor activities unpleasant without facial protection. Exposed flesh will freeze with prolonged exposure. Shortened recess period may be warranted.

NOTE: FOR WINDCHILLS LISTED BELOW, THE DECISION TO KEEP STUDENTS INDOORS IS AT THE DISCRETION OF THE PRINCIPAL.

-27°C to -34°C: Warm clothing is essential. Facial protection is recommended. Outdoor activities are not recommended. Exposed skin will freeze in 10-15 minutes. Indoor recess advised.

Below -34°C: Facial protection essential. Extremely dangerous for outdoor activities or travel. Avoid going outdoors unaccompanied. Skin will freeze in less than 10 minutes.

Below –42°C: Conditions for outdoor travel such as walking becomes dangerous. Exposed skin areas will freeze in minutes.
