Please return all registration packages to École Centrale by Friday March 28, 2025.






#### I Love to Read - J'adore lire en janvier!





#### Did you know?

Music training helps to develop language and reasoning skills. Students who have early musical training will develop the areas of the brain related to language reasoning. The left side of the brain is better developed and with music and song we can help imprint information on young minds.

Students in Kindergarten have been using rhythm sticks to start exploring instruments.

In grade 1, we have been learning how different instruments represent different characters in Peter and the Wolf.

In grade 2, we have been learning how to identify different musical elements in songs that we hear using Dan Brown's Symphonie des Animaux.

In grade 3, we have been working hard at developing our recorder skills.

In grade 4, we will be composing our own songs for the recorder.

In grade 5, we learned about the history and important musicians of the ukulele and have started learning how to play the instrument.

Students in grades 4 and 5 have also been learning about The Spirit Horse Returns in preparation for our visit to the symphony!
