Halloween Information for JT Families



Our staff are already anticipating Halloween activities for students and are thinking creatively about how to keep students safe and healthy, while still enjoying the day together. We are thinking about "safety over convenience" as we celebrate Halloween on a smaller scale.

Wednesday, October 28...

- Halloween games with our PE staff. We are not able to have Halloween gym using enclosed spaces or an obstacle course due to Manitoba Health/RETSD guidelines.

Thursday, October 29 (day 4 - Caterpillar)...

- Halloween games with PE staff for Kindergarten.
- Halloween / fall classroom activities and costumes following guidelines below.

Friday October 30, 2020...

- Teachers will be creating Fall and/or Halloween experiences and activities to be done throughout the day that include curricular connections.
- We will not be having our traditional school Halloween Parade to prevent cohorts from crossing paths and to ensure we follow the guidelines from the province of reducing the number of people that gather. Students will be able to see the costumes that other students are wearing within their own classroom setting. Unfortunately, we are not able to have any visitors in the school at this time.
- **Please do not send any treats/goodie bags/packages for your child to share with their classmates. While we appreciate generosity, we want to limit the amount of items our students will be handling.**
- **Teachers may bring in a prepackaged snack (from the store) for their whole class to enjoy at school. Items will be properly wiped down or quarantined beforehand as needed before distribution occurs.** Teachers will not be providing any treats/goodie bags/packages for their students to take home to limit the amount of items our students will be handling.
- **Students are welcome to bring their own prepackaged (from the store) special snack from home for the celebrations that teachers will be having in their classrooms. Please do not send home baking or store purchased treats that are not individually prepackaged. Keep in mind that we continue to be a nut free school.**
- **If your child chooses to wear a costume, they must wear the costume to school for the entire day, wearing the costume from home when they arrive to school. Costumes must be easy for children to be independent for bathroom needs (1 piece costumes with a tie behind the neck are not practical as staff are not able to help in this regard).** We want to prevent times where students are using the washrooms for changing.
- For our Kindergartens that attend school on alternate even days, their Fall and/or Halloween experiences will occur on Thursday October 29, 2020 and will also follow the guidelines noted.

Please remember the following guidelines when selecting a costume for your child:

- Costumes must be appropriate for K-5 students within a school setting.
- Costumes cannot be violent in nature Please leave any costume props at home. Please do any necessary preparations at home (face paint or hair).
- Costumes will be worn during the whole school day, including recess and speciality classes. Please ensure the costume is comfortable, easy to move in and will fit under a jacket. Students must be able to be independent for the bathroom.
- Costumes must not be graphic in nature (e.g. inappropriate sayings displayed/ violent).
- Costume masks cannot be worn, as students need to be recognizable and many will already be wearing masks as outlined by the province. We want students to have clear lines of vision for safety reasons.

Please have a conversation with your children regarding new regulations for Halloween. Although it will be on a smaller scale, we are happy to still be able to offer something to commemorate this event.

-  Frequently clean and disinfect commonly touched surfaces
-  Encourage hand hygiene by making hand sanitizer readily available
-  Have one person designated to serve food to guests to reduce sharing of utensils

Anybody who feels unwell should not take part in Halloween activities—use the COVID-19 screening tool and screening questions before participating.

What Should I Do if My Child is Sick?



If students have one symptom from the Column A or two from Column B, they should immediately get tested for COVID-19.

If a student displays one Column A symptom at school or two from Column B, or a combination of one Column A and one Column B, the school will immediately contact parents to pick up their child.

Column A

Do you have a new onset, or worsening, of any ONE of the following symptoms?

- Fever > 38°C or think you have a fever or chills
- Cough
- Sore throat/hoarse voice
- Shortness of breath/breathing difficulties
- Loss of taste or smell
- Vomiting or diarrhea for more than 24 hours

Column B

Do you have a new onset, or worsening, of any TWO of the following symptoms?

- Runny nose
- Muscle aches
- Fatigue
- Conjunctivitis (pink eye)
- Headache
- Skin rash of unknown cause
- Nausea or loss of appetite
- Poor feeding (if an infant)

HAUNTED HOUSE WRITING & ART

Students from Mrs. Schlag, Mr. Taylor, and Ms. Natiuk's classrooms recently completed a haunted house project. Before beginning the writing portion of the project, students looked at real estate listings to see examples of advertisements for homes. Using descriptive writing, students wrote about haunted houses. Students were encouraged to think about what they might see, hear, smell, taste, and touch inside of a haunted house. Then students experimented with tinting and blending paint to create haunted house paintings.

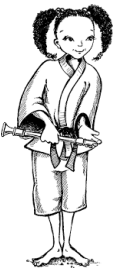

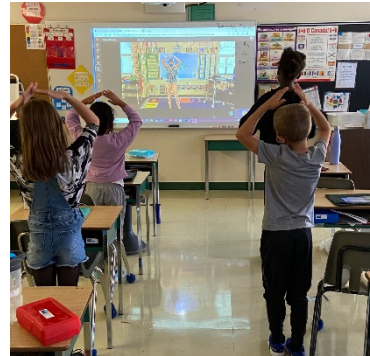

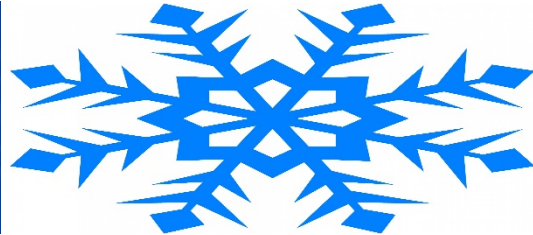

SCHOOL SAFETY PATROLS

Our patrols have been doing an incredible job of helping kids arrive at school safely each morning and get home safely after school. **Thank you Patrols!** We hope that they won't be needed for a while, but here is a reminder of our Cold Weather guidelines for our Patrols (just in case). ALL JT students are reminded to always dress for the weather!

School Patrols

When the temperature or wind chill is between -27°C and -34°C , patrols will remain on post for 10 minutes. When it is -35°C to -39°C , patrols will remain on post for five minutes. When it is -40°C and below, no patrols will be on duty.



****** Some have noticed that our Patrol posts are targeted at areas closer to the school and may have an extra patrol or two supporting the crossing. This is very intentional to ensure student safety for our Patrols with the high levels of absenteeism at school related to COVID this year. If a patrol is away, we want to ensure that there is always a partner to support the crossing.

Life-Threatening Allergies

As in the past, there are several students with life threatening allergies in Radisson School. Several of these students have their allergy to nuts and/or nut products. - Contact with even a tiny amount of an allergen can cause a severe reaction
- Check the labels on food products that are sent to school (no nut products)
- No peanut butter sandwiches or bringing any nut products to school
- Talk to your child to not share lunches or snacks

However, if you have a concern or an issue, please don't hesitate to let the school know. Open communication between home and school is very important to us.

- 1** Talk to the person most directly involved—your child's teacher. If you must leave a message, provide a day and evening phone number where the teacher can reach you.
- 2** If talking to the teacher doesn't resolve the issue, talk to the principal.
- 3** If you've talked to the principal, but the issue has not been resolved over a period of time, call the superintendent's department at 204.667.7130 or email communications@retsdp.ca.
- 4** If you disagree with the decision of the superintendent's department, you can make an appeal in writing to the board of trustees.

Rationale:

Nutrition plays a significant role in growth and development, resistance to disease, and physical and mental health. It is important for children to have food that is nutritionally well balanced. Research demonstrates a relationship between nutrition and children's physical, emotional and intellectual readiness to learn. The school will promote and foster an active healthy lifestyle for all students.

RETSD CODE OF CONDUCT

RETSD's Code of Conduct is central to the division's commitment to fostering safe, caring and inclusive schools. Originally created in 2008, this code was revised to more closely align with the Code of Conduct from Manitoba Education and Advanced Learning. The main changes include a revised definition of bullying and the addition of new technology forms.

LOCKDOWN / HOLD & SECURE

Your son/daughter's safety is very important to us. We have policies and procedures in place at both the divisional and school level to support their safety. In the last several months our school division has been working with the Winnipeg Police Service, (as well as referencing materials from the RCMP and Manitoba Education and Advanced Learning), in order to review and strengthen the procedures we have in place to protect students and staff in the event of a safety threat at school. We would like to share details of these updated procedures with you now.

Safety procedures now fall into two categories: **Hold and Secure**, and **Lockdown**.

Hold and Secure will be activated if there is a *potential threat outside the school*. In these situations, the police typically contact the school and direct the school to go into Hold and Secure. When there is no longer a threat outside the school building, the police inform us that we can resume regular activities.

If our school is in Hold and Secure, the following procedures will apply:

- All exterior doors will be locked.
- NO ENTRY signs will be placed on each door.
- No one will be permitted to leave or enter the school until school administration announces that Hold and Secure is over.

Lockdown will be activated if there is a *potential threat inside the school building*. If the school is in Lockdown, the following procedures will apply:

- All students and staff will proceed to the nearest classroom or office.
- All doors to classrooms and offices will be locked and/or barricaded by the supervising adult.
- Students will be kept away from windows and doors and instructed to remain silent and still.
- No one will be permitted to leave their room until the Lockdown is over.

Effective September 1, 2015, all schools in RETSD are required to hold at least two Lockdown and one Hold and Secure practice drills each school year. The purpose of the drills is to provide training for staff and students, so everyone knows what to do in the event of a safety threat. Everyone in the school building will participate in these drills. Students, staff and parents will be informed in advance of these practice drills.

If your son/daughter arrives at school during a Hold and Secure or Lockdown procedure, he or she must proceed to the school evacuation site, sign in and remain there until directed otherwise by administration or police. **The evacuation site for your son/daughter's school is: Park City Community Centre.**

If you arrive at the school during a Hold and Secure or Lockdown, DO NOT ATTEMPT TO ENTER THE SCHOOL. Instead, please proceed to the parent/guardian information site where divisional personnel will be available to assist you. **The parent information site for your son/daughter's school is: Westview School.**

If you hear about a serious emergency at your son/daughter's school through media reports or other means, DO NOT PROCEED TO THE SCHOOL. Instead, proceed immediately to the parent information site identified above.

Please DO NOT CALL YOUR SON/DAUGHTER'S CELL PHONE during an emergency, particularly in a Lockdown situation where it is critical to remain silent and still and not draw attention from any threat makers that may be in the building.

In closing, our purpose in sending this letter is to reassure you that we regularly review our divisional safety procedures to ensure that we are doing our best to maintain the safety of your son/daughter's learning environment. We do this through proactive planning and practice of emergency procedures in all our schools.
