- 3. Treasurer Report (Joanne):
 - We have \$7,400 in the PAC accounts currently.
 - Separate from that money is the playground account \$3516.00
 - Mom's Pantry fund's received
- 4. School Report (Anita M.)
 - Candy Canes went over very well
 - December a great month. Towards the end of the month, more kids were away sick
 - School Community really supportive of remote learning, picking up test kits
 - First week in class, going well. Division is not reporting individual COVID cases. Rather school is reporting weekly. The school will not be reporting if kids are isolating, only positive cases. If there is a large amount of cases, classes or school may move to remote learning. Or if staff are off sick, classes may move to remote learning if there are not substitutes.
 - A flow chart went out with what to do in regards to isolation.
 - The division was already classified as yellow since September (equivalent to the provincial Orange level), therefore the only change to make was three layer masks to be worn by students and teacher.
 - Parent Q: will school provide more rapid tests? A: school receiving more but for staff in school.
 Government is suppose replenish, no word yet as to when. Rapid test will only work during the contagious period.
 - Fundraising can still happen, hot lunches etc. as long as they work with the guidelines (no parents to hand out, but teachers can, individual wrapped packaging, etc.)
