If you are unable to speak to us directly, you may leave a message on the voice mail system to report the absence. Please be specific when calling in for your child. If it is an illness, please list the symptoms the child is having as well as the best number to reach you at if we have any further questions. Please note, it is always best to schedule appointments outside of school hours.

As a child learns to read, do math, and acquire French language skills, it is important that they practice those new skills daily. Regular attendance promotes new learning. Children begin to learn how to socialize with others, follow directions and solve problems creatively while at school. If a child is not part of the classroom, some of the academic and social skills cannot be practiced.
Something to keep in mind, if a child misses two classes a month, times ten months that makes 20 days or $10 \%$ of schooling missed which comes close to a whole month. If a child is absent more than $10 \%$ of the time parents will be notified by letter from the school.

## TIME TO BUNDLE UP! RETSD Cold Weather Guidelines

Sometimes, severe weather requires us to make changes to busing, outdoor recess, and safety patrolling to keep your children safe.

## School Closures

Schools very rarely close due to winter weather.

## Winter Clothing

Please ensure that your child comes dressed appropriately for the weather each day. When the temperature or wind chill is between $-27^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ and $-34^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$, warm winter clothing is essential, and facial protection is recommended. When it is below $-34^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$, facial protection is essential, and it's recommended that children avoid going outdoors unaccompanied-skin will freeze in less than 10 minutes.

## Busing

When the temperature is $-35^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ and/or wind chill is $-45^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ or colder at The Forks, metro Winnipeg school divisions (RETSD included) cancel buses for the entire day-but schools usually remain open.

We will post a cancellation alert on the RETSD website home page if buses are cancelled, and alert the media. If we have not posted a cancellation alert by 6:45 a.m., buses are running.

## School Patrols

When the temperature or wind chill is between $-27^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ and $-34^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$, patrols will remain on post for 10 minutes. When it is $-35^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ to $-39^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$, patrols will remain on post for five minutes. When it is $-40^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ and below, no patrols will be on duty.

## Recess

When the temperature or wind chill is between $-25^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ and $-27^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$, a shortened recess period may be warranted. When it is below $-27^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$, recess is usually moved indoors. This is at the discretion of the principal. *with the exception of Polar Bear Club students

## Polar Bear Club Recess

For schools participating in Polar Bear Club Recess:

- Participation is voluntary.
- Parental consent is required.
- Students who have consent can participate in all or none of the recess breaks.
- Students must be dressed appropriately, including a warm toque/hat; snow pants; face covering; warm, insulated jacket; mittens; and snow boots.
- Students can go back inside at any time.
- Staff supervision will be provided.

> All students will remain inside when the temperature/ windchill is $-40^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ or below. If you have any questions not addressed by these guidelines, please contact your child's school.

## Physical Education Program

In the Physical Education classes, students at the Grades K to 2 have been working on manipulation skills such as throwing, catching, rolling, striking, bouncing and kicking.

Classes will still be going outside from time to time, so students need to be dressed appropriately (tuque, mitts, ski pants and boots).
