Throughout this winter, regardless of temperature, our School Safety Patrol squads have been working hard to keep students safe on the way to and from school. At Joseph Teres School we continue to say "thank you" to our School Safety Patrols with treats such as hot chocolate and donuts, and special events to recognize the patrols importance to our school and the responsibility that they have. We also recognize a patrol squad of the month and display their photograph on our leadership bulletin board. Street Patrols have recently received their patrol toques, and all patrols now have their patrolling cards and patrol pins.

Patrols were recently treated to a free ticket to the Manitoba Moose Patrol Appreciation event on Monday, February 20, 2023, and a free movie courtesy of the Winnipeg Police Service on Saturday, March 4, 2023.

Patrol Weather Guidelines

Please note the cold weather guidelines below for patrols. Patrolsare trained and reminded to be dressed for the weather as we are on post rain, snow, or shine!

Patrols are only off post if there is thunder and lightning, or if the temperature with windchill is below - 40C. Reduced patrol times implemented for temperatures colder than -27C. During extremely cold weather, the following guidelines for an abbreviated student patrol schedule will befollowed.

Temperature or Windchill:

-27C to -34C It is recommended that time on post not exceed 10 minutes. Warm clothingis essential. Facial protection is recommended.

-35C to -39C It is recommended that time on post not exceed five minutes. Posts located more than a five - minute walk from the school will not be patrolled. Warmclothing and facial protection are essential.

-40C and below No student patrols are on post. The school will notify the students and parents of this abbreviated patrol schedule.

How to Dress: Patrols need to have scarves, toque, mitts, snowsuit, boots, and other warm clothing. Clothingshould not restrict the vision of the patrol.

We feel grateful to have worked with such a knowledgeable and kind person!

Kindergarten Registrations for the 2023-2024 School Year

If you have a child that will be turning 5 years old, on or before December 31, 2023 you can now register them for Kindergarten for the upcoming school year. Please come to the school office to fill out a registration package.

Registration forms can be found on the Joseph Teres School website (<u>Joseph Teres School</u>) under Documents and Forms. You will need to bring proof of residency, which will be TWO pieces of identification with your name and address on it, Please note one needs to be government issued, this can be a Manitoba Drivers License or Manitoba Health Card. You will also have to provide proof of birth for the child, this could be a Birth Certificate, Manitoba Health Card, Baptismal Certificate, Passport or a Valid Treaty Card.




Notice for Fee-For-Service Busing (dependent on availability)

2023-2024 Class Lists

In June, staff will be meeting to determine class lists for the 2023-2024 school year. This is a complex process and we are seeking parental understanding and support of this process. It is our strong belief that the learning atmosphere in the classroom must be the first consideration in the formation of class groupings. Classes are organized to maximize learning and teaching opportunities for students and for teachers. Staff teams strive to create classes that are diverse in character and balanced in all respects.

The following are all considered when determining class lists:

- Student academic and social functioning
- Our knowledge of social interactions and dynamics between individual and groups of students
- Match with class configuration and staffing allotment from our school division
- Male/female ratio
- Placement of students new to Joseph Teres School
- Creating balanced classrooms based on students' strengths and needs



Parents can assist the class formation process by:

- Helping their children to understand the importance of class formation
- Supporting placements that have been made

Parents are asked not to make specific class or Teacher requests. Given appropriate support at home and at school, it has been our experience that the vast majority of placements are successful. Where a placement is proving to be difficult, we ask that parents and students give it the time required for friendships to develop and comfort level to increase.









Parents, please send clean empty water bottles to school in your child's backpack. We have a wonderful water bottle filling stations here at school that can be used to

fill them. We are seeing an increasing number of bottles spilling and ruining items in the backpacks including Library books. Replacement of books damaged by water often cost from \$8.00 to \$25.00.

Counsellor's Corner

Hello JT families! It is hard to believe that it is already March! Hopefully soon we will see the weather warm up and see the snow start to melt.

Since the start of the year, we have been able to provide some great opportunities for students to continue to build their "tool box" of strategies to help deal with big feelings.

Every Grade 1 class had a series of lessons on Zones of Regulation that was cotaught by Ms. Ashley Ewasko, our divisional Positive Behaviour and Intervention Support Coach. Zones of Regulation teaches students how to identify and understand their own emotions, and to match the size of emotions to the size of the problem.

In Grade 2 we have started implementing Sources of Strength, which is a curriculum that focuses on building resiliency in students and helping them to discover the strengths that students have in their own lives that can help them get through difficult situations. We will implement the Sources of Strength curriculum with additional grades in the future.

Additionally, we have been able to run friendship building and social skills groups with Mr. Jonathon Bach, who has been providing additional counselling services at Joseph Teres School. Although his time at Joseph Teres is coming to an end, we are happy to have Mr. Ian McIntyre back in our building later this month to help support our students.

As a Counsellor, I am available for short term support for many needs such as anxiety, family changes, grief and friendship challenges. I am also available to help connect families to outside agency support for longer term needs. I can be reached at the school by e-mail at emurray@retsd.mb.ca

We had some wonderful quest readers, some highlights are:


- Constable Scott our School Resource Officer read to all 23 classes over several visits

- Tyler Magz, radio host from Virgin 103.1 read to many classes

















"Tansi" (Hello) from Mr. Kroetsch's class!
