
On June 13th, the students had a special visit with Golf Manitoba. They had representatives out to help teach the sport of golf in our playground.

June 2024

LAND STATEMENT

River East Transcona School Division is located on the original lands of the Anishinaabeg, Ininiwak, Anishininiwak, Dakota, and Dene peoples, and on the homeland of the Red River Métis.

We recognize our part of the Treaty relationship and, as an acknowledgement of the harms done, we commit to collaborating with Indigenous communities in the shared spirit of Truth and Reconciliation for the healing and inclusion of all who share this Land.

School Plan: 2023-2024

Our School Plan had 4 priorities this year. These priorities continued our work from the previous year. They were:

- 1. Literacy Development in Reading, Writing and Communication
- 2. Numeracy Development
- Wellbeing
- 4. Curiosity and Wonder

Highlights of the Year

Our overarching theme of Curiosity and Wonder created inspiration for our teachers and students to view things with questions and critical thinking, appreciation and creativity. Student agency goals contributed to the students setting goals, reflecting on their learning, playing and being creative with ideas and objects.

Some of the highlights of the year in learning were:

1. Having a purpose and audience when writing.

Students doing daily writing in all subjects was important. Word study, spelling, and having lots of ideas and information from reading, conversations and mentor texts enhanced their writing. The celebration of students writing messages and the author's (the student writer) impact on an audience were regularly celebrated! Having some writing pieces for each student proceed to a finished product with correct spelling and clarity was important.

2. Daily student reading

Reading every day with teacher instruction and for students' interests, along with books being read to students daily by their teachers expanded students' literacy skills and contributed to our goals of critical thinking and language development. Appreciation of stories, both written and oral were emphasized.

3. Wellbeing

Students developing skills of being confident and proud of their achievements was a daily goal. When conflicts occurred, having students learn to problem solve to resolve issues with others and set goals for a more successful response in the future were worked on throughout the school. Varying levels of support that was required was put in place so that all students would be successful. The purposeful inclusion of Student Voice, Student Agency, and Student Leadership (especially with our Grade 5 Student Leadership Group) has been important for students to develop and communicate their ideas, goals, goals and actions.

4. Numeracy Development and Competence with Mathematical Thinking

Working with manipulatives, playing, noticing numbers, numeracy and math connections in the environment and in books all contribute to numeracy understanding. Students have discussed and learned about various ways to solve math problems. Students have practised math facts and learned important math information to use in their decisions about problem solving. In Kindergarten and Grade 1 we have had the opportunity to have extra numeracy support in the

classes so that all students can achieve the best foundation to understand numeracy. Math has been connected to all subjects in the work done in classrooms. We have strived to have all students know that they are skilled with math! We have been using strategies and problems from a book called *Messy Math* and we also have been doing a lot of Math learning outside.

5. The Arts

Music classes, Grade Level Assemblies, Music Monday and Music Month, our Winter Concert have been highlights for the inclusion of Music for all students.

Music classes have included singing, movement and playing instruments, encouraging all student to love Music.

For the expression of ideas, interests, patterns, and colour, art has been a focus in all classrooms. We have loved how students' art, in may formats and using many mediums, has enlivened bulletin boards and projects throughout the year!

6. Exercise and Fun

Phys. Ed classes, recess and Clubs have provided many opportunities for fun and active living for all students!

Activity Clubs this year have included volleyball, basketball, gymnastics, cross country running, soccer, dancing, games.

7. Appreciating Our World

Sustainable Development ideas in the areas of the environment and people playing, working, and collaborating peacefully together have been regular topics throughout the year in all classes. All students are citizens with strengths, gifts and responsibilities to have a wonderful world around them. Recycling batteries (This year we won the Earth Rangers Challenge!), recycling paper & markers, Earth Rangers Assemblies and other special guests visiting to school to enhance students' interest and learning about the world around them have helped us learn more about the world. Field trips, daily recycling, and clubs such as the Kindness Club have been exciting!

8. Justice, Equity, Diversity and Inclusion

This area has always been extremely important as our students reflect a diverse community, each bringing special qualities to their classes that contribute to the excellence of the work done at John de Graff School. The staff have worked with their classes to create and continually hold high expectations and a climate of kindness and learning for all students.

9. Working with the Parent Advisory Council (PAC)

PAC has met once per month, contributing to the ongoing opportunities at John de Graff for a sustainable Lunch Program, purchases of learning and play resources for students, supporting and collaborating with staff about ideas. We appreciate their dedication to our students and school and appreciate them!

10. Truth and Reconciliation

We work on how to talk to and about each other with great respect. We read to students, discuss with students, and create art with students to understand the past and help to create a better future. One of the school times when this is done is for Orange Shirt Day, but many other opportunities are facilitated by teachers. This work at John de Graff with continue.

Some other important highlights in the year have been:

- Field Trips by all classes to extend learning outside of the classroom (Examples are: The Zoo, Mariash Quarries, The Manitoba Museum, The Human Rights Museum, The Farm, Bowling, Volleyball Competition, Manitoba Theatre for Young People, Cross Country Run Event)
- The Meaning of Home Writing done by Grades 4 and 5 students
- The continual building of excellent Classroom and Main Library book collections
- Intriguing Bulletin Boards and student explanations of what their class has been learning about
- Robotics learning with facilitators from the University of Manitoba and a visit from the Winnipeg Police with their bomb detection robot

- Hosting Monarch Butterfly caterpillars until they turn into beautiful butterflies and the students release them to nature
- Computer Coding
- Book Buddies
- Kindergarten Open House
- Grade 5 Farewell Celebration
- Patrols and their excellent work and a Patrol Celebration.
- Learning about golf facilitated by Golf Manitoba
- Special Lunches organized by PAC
- Winter Sports Day and Field Day
- Technology used as a tool for learning (accessing information, developing photo stories and power points, using interactive websites for problem solving and math, developing charts and graphs for illustrating data, using apps for particular purposes, and using a green screen for photos to enhance students' work and projects are some of the IT things we have done).
- Guest Readers throughout the school
- Play Week in March
- STEAM activities done schoolwide
- Use of the outdoors as a learning area and 2 new trees that have purchased and planted by PAC for shade by our Outdoor Classroom area
- MYRCA Book Club (Grade 5) Students went to the province wide event for the reveal of the 2024 "Honour Book" and runner up book
- Battle of the Books (Grade 3) with award winning books from North America. JdG students attended the divisional Battle of the Books and came in 2nd place!
- Our successful Lunch Program organized by PAC and Mrs. Susanne Kilbrei along with the classroom Lunch Supervisors
- The Grade 2 Fairy Tale Month finishing off with the Fairy Tale Ball
- Excellence in teaching and learning
- Celebration of the Grade 5 students moving on to Middle Years that included a special lunch, a family time for photos and visiting, slurpee

treats, and recognition at our final assembly. Thanks to PAC for supporting these celebrations.
