


JWG students participated in a STEAM Challenge in late May, Early June. The challenge was to build a car powered by nothing but a rubber band. The farther the car went, and the fewer materials used to build it, the higher their score was. Students had criteria to consider while designing and building their cars. They had to have an axle and a minimum of 2 wheels, the supplies which they built from were limited to straws, skewers, paper and cardboard. Their wheels could be made from any recycled or repurposed materials such as bottle caps or CDs. There were 3 different categories for students to compete in:

- 1. Top score, accomplished through furthest distance and least number of materials used.
- 2. Best Design, creativity and craftmanship were considered.
- 3. Design Process, students were acknowledged for planning, researching, building, testing, adapting, and retesting their cars.














GRADE 6






GRADE 8

At JWG we exploded in joy and celebration during our Culturama day! It was amazing all around. The talents of our students are remarkable.










Grade 8 Canoe Trip


Fee-For-Service applications must be submitted to the Transportation Department by June 30th of each school year. Applications received after June 30th will be reviewed on an individual basis.
