



Welcome to the June 5, 2023 Wayoata School Community Council.


During Ukrainian Club actively engaged our newcomers to Canada with a wide variety of activities. On May 15<sup>th</sup> they celebrated Embroidery Day.








Mr. Behren's Grade 3/4 class has been using the PowerPoint program to prepare presentation on topics in Science, Social Studies, and French.



Students had opportunity to project and orally share their presentations to the class. In the French classes they were working at developing their French vocabulary.






Students played board games, puzzles, cards, and so much more!
