Kindergarten Registrations for the 2024-2025 School Year

If you have a child that will be turning 5 years old, on or before December 31, 2024, you can now register them for Kindergarten for the upcoming school year. Please come to the school office to fill out a registration package.

Registration forms can be found on the Joseph Teres School website ([Joseph Teres School1](#)) under Documents and Forms. You will need to bring proof of address, which will be TWO pieces of identification with your name and address on it, please note one needs to be government issued, this can be a Manitoba Drivers License or Manitoba Health Card. You will also have to provide proof of birth for the child, this could be a Birth Certificate, Manitoba Health Card, Baptismal Certificate, Passport, or a Valid Treaty Card.

2024-2025 Class Lists

In June, staff will be meeting to determine class lists for the 2024-2025 school year. This is a complex process, and we are seeking parental understanding and support of this process. It is our strong belief that the learning atmosphere in the classroom must be the first consideration in the formation of class groupings. Classes are organized to maximize learning and teaching opportunities for students and for teachers. Staff teams strive to create classes that are diverse in character and balanced in all respects.

The following are all considered when determining class lists:

- Student academic and social functioning.
- Our knowledge of social interactions and dynamics between individual and groups of students.
- Match with class configuration and staffing allotment from our school division.
- Male/female ratio.
- Placement of students new to Joseph Teres School.
- Creating balanced classrooms based on students' strengths and needs.



Parents can assist the class formation process by:

- Helping their children to understand the importance of class formation.
- Supporting placements that have been made.

Parents are asked not to make specific class or Teacher requests. Given appropriate support at home and at school, it has been our experience that the vast majority of placements are successful. Where a placement is proving to be difficult, we ask that parents and students give it the time required for friendships to develop and comfort level to increase.

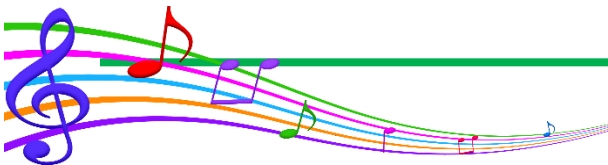

Hello JT Families!

It is hard to believe that it is already March! Hopefully soon we will see the weather warm up and the snow start to melt. Since the start of the year, we have been able to provide some great opportunities for students to continue to build their "tool box" of strategies to help deal with big feelings. In Grade 2 we have continued to run the Sources of Strength program, which is a curriculum that focuses on building resiliency in students and helping them to discover the strengths that students have in their own lives that can help them get through difficult situations. All staff have been trained on the Sources of Strength curricula, and many classrooms are already implementing the lessons and resources. In 2024 - 2025, Sources of Strength will be implemented school wide. As well, we have been able to run friendship building and social skills groups through Ms. Block (one of our Resource Teachers and Counsellors) and Mrs. Calderwood (our divisional Social Worker). We also had the opportunity to welcome Mrs. Schlag (a Grade 4 Teacher at Joseph Teres School) to our Student Services team in a half time capacity.

As Counsellors, we are available for short term support for many needs such as anxiety, family changes, grief, and friendship challenges. We are also available to help connect families to outside agency support for longer term needs.

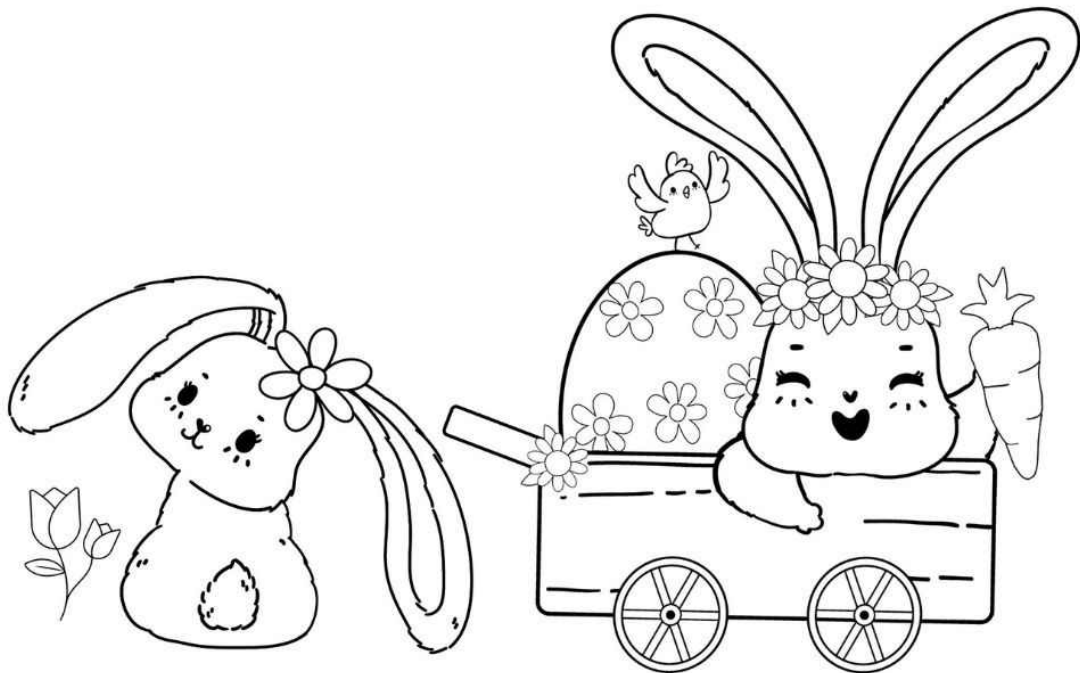
At the end of the challenge a draw will be made from the Golden Garbage Can winners for a waste free pizza party!

We had a great month celebrating reading and the fact that **We are Book Dragons** at JT, not book worms!

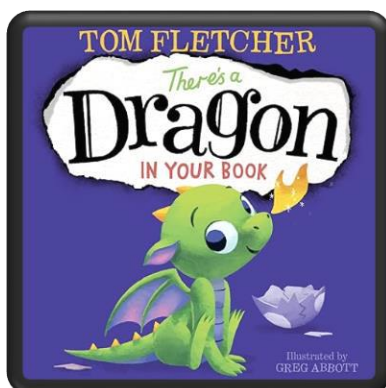

Throughout this winter, regardless of temperature, our School Safety Patrol squads have been working hard to keep students safe on the way to and from school. At Joseph Teres School we continue to say "Thank You" to our School Safety Patrols with treats such as hot chocolate and chips, and special events to recognize the patrols importance to our school and the responsibility that they have. We also recognize a street patrol and bus patrol of the month and display their photograph on our leadership bulletin board. Street Patrols have received their patrol toques, and all patrols have received their patrolling cards and patrol pins.

Patrols were also recently treated to a free ticket to the Manitoba Moose Patrol Appreciation event on Monday, February 19, 2024.



School Safety Patrol applications will be handed out to Grade 4 students in the coming week, and training will begin in April. Stay tuned!

Patrol Weather Guidelines

With the colder weather here, please note the cold weather guidelines below for patrols. Patrols are trained and reminded to be dressed for the weather as we are on post rain, snow, or shine! Patrols are only off post if there is thunder and lightning, or if the temperature with windchill is below -40C. Reduced patrol times implemented for temperatures colder than -27C. During extremely cold weather, the following guidelines for an abbreviated student patrol schedule will be followed.

Temperature or Windchill:

-27C to -34C It is recommended that time on post not exceed 10 minutes. Warm clothing is essential. Facial protection is recommended.

-35C to -39C It is recommended that time on post not exceed five minutes. Posts located more than a five - minute walk from the school will not be patrolled. Warm clothing and facial protection are essential.

-40C and below No student patrols are on post. The school will notify the students and parents of this abbreviated patrol schedule.

How to Dress: Scarves, toque, mitts, snowsuit, boots, and other warm clothing. Clothing should not restrict the vision of the patrol.

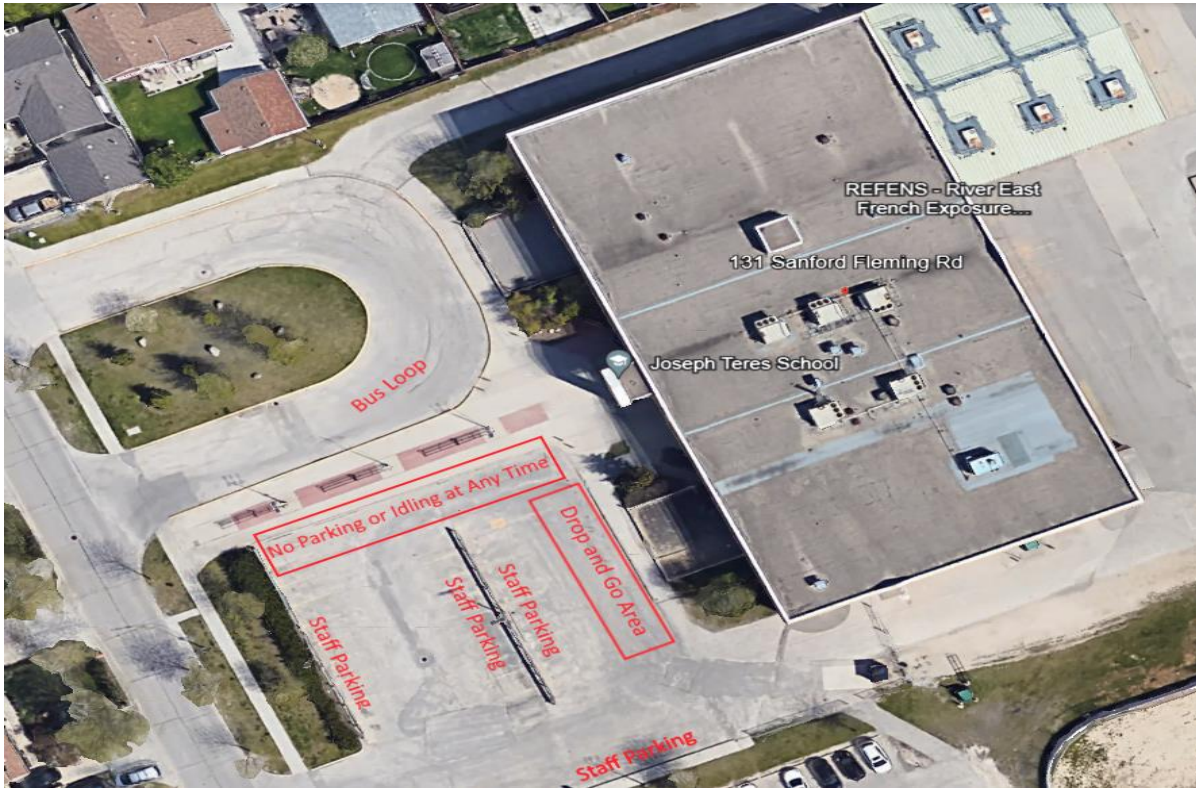
