Kindergarten Registrations for the 2025-2026 School Year

If you have a child that will be turning 5 years old, on or before December 31, 2025, you can now register them for Kindergarten for the upcoming school year. Please come to the school office to fill out a registration package.

Registration forms can be found on the Joseph Teres School website (<u>Joseph Teres School</u>) under Documents and Forms. You will need to bring proof of address, which will be TWO pieces of identification with your name and address on it, please note one needs to be government issued, this can be a Manitoba Driver's License or Manitoba Health Card. You will also have to provide proof of birth for the child, this could be a Birth Certificate, Manitoba Health Card, Baptismal Certificate, Passport, or a Valid Treaty Card.

The following are all considered when determining class lists:


- Student academic and social functioning.

- Creating balanced classrooms based on students' strengths and needs.


Parents can assist the class formation process by:

- Supporting placements that have been made.





The gymnasts, Physical Education Teachers, and coaches would like to thank everyone who attended the Tumbling Rally—we appreciate your support!




After spring break, our Grade 4 Zone Handball and Grade 5 Mini Handball clubs will begin!

Did you know that we accept gently used children's books in the library. Just drop them off at the office and we will find them a new home.





Choosing their own books empowers children and inspires them on their journey to becoming lifelong readers


I Love to Read 2025

This year's theme was the BOSCARS (Book Oscars)! Classes read 3 books in each of 4 categories and voted for their favorite.


Students who did cover art or activities for the books received a gold trophy sticker, see some examples below.









These were the four winning books as voted by students.















We had Student Choice Awards for Most Popular Series, the winner was Dog Man and Dav Pilkey the creator of Dog Man was also our most popular Illustrator.


When driving in the community club parking lot, please use rules of a parking lot, stay to the right side like vehicles do on the streets.
