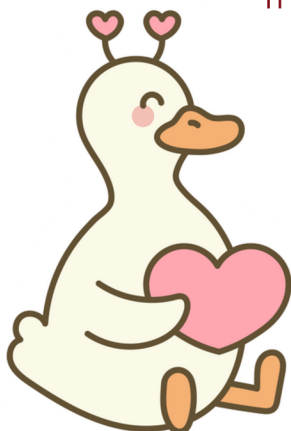

Kindergarten registration for the 2026–2027 school year begins March 2, 2026. Your child must be 5 years old on or before December 31, 2026, to be eligible to register. We require a copy of your child's birth certificate at the time of registration. Registration forms are available on our website now and can be brought to the school or emailed to ec@retsd.mb.ca. You can also pick up a registration package from the office. Please call 204-958-6426 to plan for the pickup. Welcoming new students is a source of great joy for us, and it marks the beginning of thinking and planning the possibilities for the upcoming school year. We eagerly anticipate meeting and getting to know our new students, so that we can create a positive and enriching learning environment for all.

We are requesting that children wear their running shoes at school, not slippers. Sometimes floors may be wet and slippery causing safety issues. When we practice emergency evacuation, students need to have proper footwear. As well, labelling of clothing, boots and runners would eliminate confusion. There is a lost and found box at school that is overflowing with items that were lost and cannot be returned to the proper owner because they were not labelled. Remember to dress for the weather and label all clothing.

Students are invited to wear pink to show their support for inclusivity and kindness towards others.

As an extension, March will be Kindness Month at École Centrale. Students will be given a picture of a bison hoof when they are seen or heard showing kindness towards others. In Indigenous culture, the Bison represents the sacred relationship between humans. Once they receive a hoof, students will colour it and glue it onto the poster-sized cardboard pink shirt on their classroom door. The number of hooves received will be tallied and if the school goal is reached, we celebrate by having a Dance Party in the gym (K- grade 2, then Grade 3- Grade 5) on Friday, March 27th.

Music training helps to develop language and reasoning skills. Students who have early musical training will develop the areas of the brain related to language reasoning. The left side of the brain is better developed and with music and song we can help imprint information on young minds.

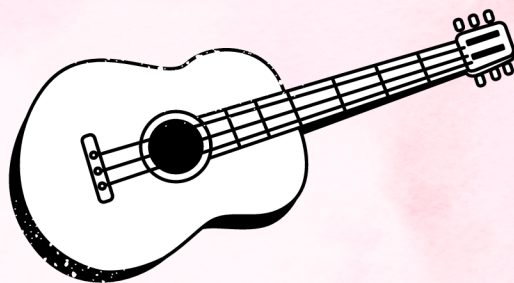
Students in Kindergarten have been using rhythm sticks to start exploring instruments. In grade 1, we have been learning how different instruments represent different characters in Peter and the Wolf. In grade 2, we have been learning how to identify different musical elements in songs that we hear using Camille Saint-Saens' Carnival des Animaux.

In grade 3, we are just about ready to start developing our recorder skills. In grade 4, we have been practicing recorder and will be getting ready for our trip to the WSO in April! In grade 5, we learned about the history and important musicians of the ukulele and will start learning how to play the instrument.
