It is beneficial for all when you register your kindergarten student early:

- * It is helpful in school classroom planning, for determining class sizes and teachers
- * It is helpful for the parent in preparing their child for the school environment and avoiding the last minute rush
- It is helpful for the student to come to the Kindergarten Orientation and meet the teacher and see the classroom

In order to register your child for Kindergarten, THE FOLLOWING IDENTIFICATION IS REQUIRED:

TWO (2) PIECES OF PROOF OF RESIDENCY:

This can be your Manitoba Medical Card, driver's license, lease agreement or current offer to purchase (duly signed), or current utility bill (name and corresponding address)

ONE (1) PIECE OF PROOF OF AGE:

This can be your child's birth certificate, passport, baptismal papers, passport, health card, treaty card, or record of live birth. (Your child has to have been born in 2018, turning 5 years of age before December 31, 2023)

Please pass this information on to any families that you know has a child eligible to register for Kindergarten for the 2023-2024 school year.

"Grandmother Moon tells the story of two eleven-year-olds, born under the same blood moon, but in different parts of the world. This play follows their stories as they meet in a forest, and that of their descendants who meet in the present day in what is known as Manitoba. A broken promise from the past can be righted when there is finally an openness to learn from those who have protected and honoured the waterways for centuries."

Meaning of Home

Room 19 has participated in the 'Meaning of home' challenge this month. It is a nationwide competition between grades 4, 5 and 6 students that asks students to write an essay, poem or paragraph about what home means to them.

The challenge is put on by Habitat for Humanity with all monies raised going towards home/house building projects across the country. Here in Manitoba there are 50 housing projects in place to provide for families without an affordable living space. Each students entry raised \$10.

Since 2007, over 90,000 students have participated in the Meaning of Home contest. Thanks to their inspiring words, and the support of founding sponsor SagenTM 1, award sponsors Urban Systems Foundation, Home Trust, and Face to Face Games, and judging sponsors Travelers Canada and Hunter Douglas, the Meaning of Home contest has raised over \$2 million to build homes across Canada for families in need of decent and affordable housing.

Thank you to the students who participated and good luck with your entries.

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


