BIKE RODEO

On June 6th we hosted the MPI Bike Rodeo which was **a great success!** Students were invited to bring their bikes, scooters and helmets, to school for the day and participate in some learning around bike and road safety.

First we started our day with a whole school presentation where we learned to do a quick ABC bike check - air in the tires, brakes are working and the chain is in place. Then we learned about how to make sure our helmets fit properly using the 2V1 check -2 fingers of forehead showing, straps fit in a V around the ear and 1 finger between the chin strap and our chin.



Lastly, we learned what the road signs mean. Then during the day, each class took their bikes outside and learned some important road hand signals that cyclists use. We had a chance to practice all these skills whilst riding around a small course set up by our friends Derek and

Theo from MPI.







Everyone had a great day! Thank you to MPI for helping us learn to be bike safe and a big thank you to our community for supporting this important learning opportunity for our

students, by encouraging them to bring their bikes.


