# The Plants We're Tracking by Room 26















#### AT OUR SCHOOL

# **Student Smudge Leadership**



### **Mural Reveal and Indigenous Education Evening**



#### **Parent Portal**

Due to the change that will be occurring this fall with the Student Information System (SIS), please take note of the following information:

As of July 31, 2024, the Tyler parent portal will be closed.

- Parents who want to keep hard copies of any data in their child's Tyler portal account should download the files and save them to their own computer. After July 31, they will not be accessible.
- The launching of the PowerSchool parent portal will not take place until mid- to late fall 2024. The division expects the new portal to be ready for the first reporting period.
- Once our new PowerSchool portal is up and running, we will be in communication with all families to guide them through the steps to access it.

Transportation and bus routes for fall 2024:

- If your children are transported to school by RETSD, you will receive information about your child's transportation schedule by email. Due to the change in our SIS, this information will not be on the portal.
- The division expects this communication to take place in mid-August.
- In mid-June, families of bused students will receive a letter from the transportation department describing a new app that will be available for student transportation information.
- If you are unable to download the app for whatever reason, families will receive the transportation schedule via email, as mentioned above.

#### Fees and billing:

• The soonest we expect online fee payment to be available in PowerSchool is after spring break 2025. In the meantime, schools will accept cash or cheques. If you are looking to pay any outstanding fees, you can do this on the Tyler portal until July 12. After that date, outstanding fees will need to be paid by cash or cheque at the school.

Stopfinder, for the upcoming school year. Stopfinder is an easy-to-use, all-in-one app that provides the
most accurate information about your child's busing schedule, anytime from anywhere.
Stopfinder can be downloaded for free from the App Store or Google Play. You will need an
invitation from the school division to register before you can access your child's busing schedule.

address by June 28, 2024.
