School Resource Officer (SRO) role includes public safety and law-related education, anti-bullying initiatives, as well as being a positive role model to our students and help support them in making positive choices. SRO's are a proactive communitybased crime prevention strategy that strengthen

relationships between police, community, and students. The SRO is responsible to work co-operatively with

The SRO is responsible to work co-operatively with school administrators, staff, students, as well as parents and the community via the school administrator to:



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 Identify and address school concerns or problems.

➡ Present a learning environment through counselling, structured classroom lectures and distribution of educational resource materials.

→ Liaise with other agencies which are or can be a resource to the school, thus opening a two-way communication dialogue.

- Enforce the law, and conduct investigations as the need arises.
- Prevent crime by being a visible law enforcement in schools.




Woodworking


These are STEAM/STEM projects that require students to understand scientific, engineering and manufacturing principles.

Students are submitting the bridges to receive some destructive testing to see how much weight they hold and how efficient their use of materials was. The bridges are made from 5mm x 5mm basswood strips. They researched and studied trusses, beams, and other engineering principles. Then using a chemical fastener, they built their bridges to specific criteria. We look forward to crushing/ testing them soon!

With the boomerangs, students studied the Bernoulli principle of flight, pressures, etc. As well as Indigenous use of boomerangs. Students had to correctly shape and decorate a CNC router and cut boomerang blank out of plywood. They then had to send pictures and video of them testing it. As Mr. Korkosh put it, the ultimate Covid game, a one-person game of catch!

Through the Career development credits in Manitoba, students at Transcona Collegiate participate in a variety of different communitybased employment opportunities with local businesses and organizations.




Performing Arts
