
Thank you to our families for joining us at our John de Graff School Open House on Thursday, October 13th!

Do you know that Truth & Reconciliation Week was held from September 26th- 30th across Canada?

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Your son/daughter's safety is very important to us. We have policies and procedures in place at both the divisional and school level to support their safety. In the past our school division has been working with the Winnipeg Police Service, (as well as referencing materials from the RCMP and Manitoba Education and Advanced Learning), in order to review and strengthen the procedures we have in place to protect students and staff in the event of a safety threat at school. We would like to share details of these procedures with you now.

Safety procedures now fall into two categories: Hold and Secure, and Lockdown.

Hold and Secure will be activated if there is a *potential threat outside* the school. In these situations, the police typically contact the school and direct the school to go into Hold and Secure. When there is no longer a threat outside the school building, the police inform us that we can resume regular activities.

If our school is in Hold and Secure, the following procedures will apply:

All exterior doors will be locked.

NO ENTRY signs will be placed on each door.

No one will be permitted to leave or enter the school until school administration announces that Hold and Secure is over.

Lockdown will be activated if there is a *potential threat inside the school building*. If the school is in Lockdown, the following procedures will apply:

All students and staff will proceed to the nearest classroom or office.

All doors to classrooms and offices will be locked and/or barricaded by the supervising adult.

Students will be kept away from windows and doors and instructed to remain silent and still.

No one will be permitted to leave their room until the Lockdown is over, unless there is a safe exit from the school that is possible.





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All schools in RETSD are required to hold at least two Lockdown and one Hold and Secure practice drills each school year. The purpose of the drills is to provide training for staff and students so everyone knows what to do in the event of a safety threat. Everyone in the school building will participate in these drills. Students, staff and parents will be informed in advance of these practice drills.

If your son/daughter arrives at school during a Hold and Secure or Lockdown procedure, he or she must proceed to the student evacuation site, sign in and remain there until directed otherwise by administration or police. The student evacuation site for your son/daughter's school is: Bertrun E. Glavin School, 166 Antrim Road, Phone: 204-669-1277.

If you arrive at the school during a Hold and Secure or Lockdown, DO NOT ATTEMPT TO ENTER THE SCHOOL. For serious situations, please proceed to the parent/guardian information site where divisional personnel will arrive as soon as possible to assist you. The parent information site for your son/daughter's school is: Valley Gardens School, 220 Antrim Road, Phone: 204-668-6249.

If you hear about a serious emergency at your son/daughter's school through media reports or other means, DO NOT PROCEED TO THE SCHOOL. Instead, proceed to the parent information site identified above.

Please DO NOT CALL YOUR SON/DAUGHTER'S CELL PHONE during an emergency, particularly in a Lockdown situation where it is critical to remain silent and still and not draw attention from any threat makers that may be in the building.

In closing, our purpose in sending this letter is to reassure you that we regularly review our divisional safety procedures to ensure that we are doing our best to maintain the safety of your son/daughter's learning environment. We do this through proactive planning and practise of emergency procedures in all of our schools.



MESSAGE FROM OUR SAFETY PATROLS:

Welcome back, family and friends of John de Graff School. We are the Grade 5 school safety patrol team and we have a special message to deliver to you today.

Crossing the street can be very dangerous at times. We are here to help make sure you get to and from school safely every day.

Here are a few quick safety tips:



Students

- * Stop behind the patrols
- * Walk your bike across the street
- * Cross only when the patrol says it is safe
- * Make sure all cars have stopped before crossing if the patrols are not on duty yet
- * Always listen to the school patrols
- * Be respectful of everybody on the bus and listen to the bus patrols

Family and Friends

- * Drivers need to obey the 30km/hr speed zone
- * Parked cars need to be at least 10 meters from the patrol crossings
- * Please do not drive through the bus loop when patrols are on duty

BUS EVACUATION DRILLS

The Public Schools Act, P250-R.M. 465/88 R - Pupil Instruction, states the following:

"The school board shall ensure that at least twice in each school year each pupil is instructed in safe school bus riding practices and participates in emergency school bus evacuation drills which shall be conducted at least once during the fall term and at least once during the spring term of each school year."

The River East Transcona Transportation Department has an excellent safety record. In maintaining this record, we carry out Bus Evacuation programs in all of our schools in the early fall and late spring of each school year.

These practice drills are carried out so that in the event of an emergency, our students can evacuate the bus as quickly and safely as possible.

The safety of our children is of the utmost importance and must be given first consideration.

Tabs for Wheelchairs 25th ANNIVERSARY 2023



HAYDEN

Bernard will be 17 years old this summer and in Grade 12 at Vincent Massey Collegiate this fall. Bernard was born with proximal femoral focal deficiency (PFFD). This is a complex birth defect in which the upper part of the femur bone (in the thigh) is either malformed or missing, causing one leg to be shorter than the other. For Bernard, it affected the growth of his right leg. He is an above-knee hip disarticulated amputee.

He plays wheelchair basketball for Team Manitoba within the Manitoba Wheelchair Sport Association. He has also competed with the Men's U23 National Team — Wheelchair Basketball Canada. His interests are, of course, basketball, music, Japanese cartoons, and fashion.

Bernard has already played for the World Juniors and World Nationals. He is one of the youngest that has ever played for these teams. His immediate future plans, after graduation in 2023, will be to travel and compete on the Senior Men's Team with Team Canada. We will be so proud to be able to present him with not just a sport wheelchair, but a Top End Pro custom-built basketball wheelchair designed for athletes.

Hayden is 15 years old and will be in Grade 10 at Lord Selkirk Regional Comprehensive Secondary School this fall. He was born with a perfect bill of health and wasn't diagnosed with Cerebral Palsy until he was nine months old.

Hayden is known for his smile, sense of humor and very kind heart. He has a younger sister whom he simply adores and loves to go to her hockey games to watch her play. When he is not getting his hair styled, he is busy online gaming with his friends, or spending the day outdoors quadding with his family. Although he sees himself being a computer programmer in the future, his family thinks he has a calling to be a counsellor. He is an "old soul" and is often giving great advice to friends and family.

Presently, Hayden has a power wheelchair, but has a great need for a manual one. A manual one will allow him to continue to work on his fine motor skills by navigating around his house and going to places that are not power wheelchair (200-300 lbs.) friendly. It will be our pleasure to give him an ultralight manual wheelchair!
