COLDER WEATHER... Reminder

So far we have been very lucky with fantastic weather. However, as the season grows cooler, 30-minute recess can seem like a long time to be outside when not dressed appropriately for the weather. Please take in to consideration that the temperature changes drastically throughout the day and students should be dressed in layers. Proper footwear is also crucial this time of year for wet and cold conditions as well as hats, and gloves/mittens. Please label your child's boots and clothing! It is important for children to engage in outdoor play for exercise, breathing fresh air, and engaging with friends during recess.

HALLOWEEN at school

Halloween classroom activities will take place on Tuesday October 31st. Students are invited to dress up in costumes. When choosing Halloween costumes, please remember that **replica weapons** are **not permitted** at school (this includes replica guns, knives, axes, etc.). Halloween is fast approaching and while we will have opportunities for students to dress up and take part in celebrations and community building, we would like to remind parents that no one's culture or identity is to be used as a costume. **Costumes that involve cultural appropriation are not acceptable**.

Students will be able to bring their own treat to have during their class activity. Students are not allowed to share or give any treats to fellow classmates due to numerous allergies and food intolerances at school. <u>Only packaged treats with a list of ingredients will be allowed at school</u> or a fruit or veggie.

PBIS

Here at École Centrale, we are implementing our classroom treaty within our PBIS framework. This is a division-wide initiative. In designing classrooms and our school day, we seek to create spaces and systems that will enable students to be academically and emotionally successful. In order to maximize learning opportunities, we must create environments where children are able to process their emotions and transform their inner states; They must be enveloped by a responsive school culture that acknowledges their inner lives as well as their external behaviors and accomplishments.

A few important items for the upcoming month:

- Lunch Program Registrations and Fees are now due. The lunch program is a fee-for-service program.
 These fees allow the Lunch Program Committee to determine and hire the correct number of lunch supervisors. At present we have 330 students regularly for lunch but only 248 registrations and fees. This means we are short lunch program supervisors.

ATTENDANCE

If your child is going to be absent or late for school for any reason, please contact the office at 204-958-6426. If you are unable to speak to us directly, you may leave a message on the voice mail system to report the absence. Please be specific when calling-in your child. If it is an illness, we need to know **the symp-toms** the child is having as well as the best number to reach you at if we have any further questions.

Absences are considered "unexcused" if we do not hear from a parent/guardian by 9 am. A student who is absent more than 10 minutes of morning or afternoon attendance will be recorded as tardy. Please keep this in mind as you schedule appointments for your children. It is always best to schedule appointments during non-school hours. Students are expected to be in class from 8:20 am to 3:00 pm daily.

As a child learns to read and acquires basic math skills, it is important that they practice those new skills daily. Regular attendance promotes new learning. Children begin to learn how to socialize with others, follow directions, and solve problems creatively while at school. Something to keep in mind is if a child misses two classes per month over the course of ten months that equates to 20 days of schooling missed which comes close to a whole month.


Special Events
