



Options for University Entrance



Must meet high school graduation requirements and have 5 full credits at the S, G or U level - PE does not count



Regular - 5 courses needed; minimum of 70% average in 4 courses including Eng, Math and two other S courses with a minimum grade of 60% in any course (could only use 1 of drama, dance, graphics, electronics, woods)

Limited admission/ same as above except a minimum average of 65% with no less than 55% in each course

University of Winnipeg-

5 Grade 12 S or G courses required to apply

Present a minimum of one core credit in English (Comprehensive, Literary or Transactional Focus), one credit of Mathematics (Pre- Cal, Applied or Essentials) and one other 40S level course with a minimum 65% average overall.

Admission to Colleges

Most colleges require a regular high school diploma which means 30 credits, including English 40S, Math 40S, PE 40F and two other 40 level courses.

- Specific math or science requirements may apply depending on the program
- Check with the college for specific details.
- Red River, Assiniboine, Booth, Robertson, Herzing, Wellington, etc



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Newcomer /International Students

- Please communicate directly with an advisor at the post- secondary institution of your choice.
- Residency status, visa requirements, language proficiency, etc. are individually determined factors in your application

Entrance Scholarships at U of M

5 of the following grade 12 courses will be used to calculate your average for entrance scholarships:

- *English (may use two English courses)
- *Math - Pre Cal or Applied
- *Biology, Chemistry, Physics and Computer Science
- *Family Studies or Foods and Nutrition
- *Global Issues
- *French or another language
- *Music (one only)
- *Visual Art
- *Current Topics in First Nations, Metis and Inuit Studies

Entrance Scholarships at U of W

Your average will be calculated based on your English, Math and one other 40S level course

- English – any of the three types we offer
- Math –Pre- Cal, Applied or Essentials
- Best other 40S course

(Dance and Electronics do not count but any other 40s course does)

Scholarship Values

University of Winnipeg

95% and over - \$2250

90%-94.9% - \$1750

85%-89.9% - \$1100

University of Manitoba

95% and over - \$3000

90%-94.9% - \$2000

85%-89.9% - \$1000

Offers are based on first semester final grades and second semester interim grades. Final transcripts are reviewed and offers may be adjusted , depending on the institution.

*** separate monetary awards are also offered for AP courses scoring 4 or 5 (\$150-\$250.00 per course) at U of M

How Do I Apply?

- The best way to apply to any post – secondary institution is online.
- Once you have applied to either university you are automatically entitled to entrance scholarships provided you meet the **minimum grade average of 85%** and fully apply by the deadline of **Mar. 1st**

The Application Process

- ✓ Adhere to deadlines (late applications are not accepted)
- ✓ Provide References (ask early)
- ✓ Essays (free of errors, easy to read)
- ✓ Save applications
- ✓ Accomplishments (make a list)
- ✓ Match accomplishments with award criteria

What to do next?

- 1) Set a reminder in your phone to check the TEAMS – grade 12 info channel weekly and the Scholarship link on the TC homepage
- 2) Check out myblueprint.ca for help with career planning. Use your school log in to access this.
- 3) Explore post-secondary information – either in person or online

Remember:

Not everyone knows what they want to do “when they grow up” – that’s okay – you will figure it out as you explore options

(Ask your parents or other adults if they are still doing the same job that they thought they would be doing at age 17)

Apply for scholarships – sometimes there are few applicants. If you spend 5 hours on an application and are awarded \$500.00 – you were paid \$100/hour!!!!
