

Creation of 2021-2022 Class Lists

In May, teachers will have release time to meet to determine class lists for the 2021-2022 school year, as they have in the past at École Springfield Heights School. <u>This year we will have several combined classes in both English and French Immersion programs</u>.



Many factors go into preparing class lists. It is a complex process and we are again seeking parental understanding and support of this process. Classes are organized to maximize learning and teaching opportunities for students and for teachers. Teachers listen and talk to their students; have discussions with parents throughout the year and then using their professional judgement make the best possible placement decision for each child.

Staff teams strive to create classes that are diverse in character and balanced in all respects, including thought given to students' friendships that support best learning practices. The following are all considered when determining class lists:

- A balance of student academic needs/strengths and social functioning
- Our knowledge of social interactions and dynamics between individual students and groups of students
- A match with class configuration and staffing, including the allotment from our school division
- Placement of students new to Springfield Heights School
- Male/female ratio

Parents can assist the class formation process by:

- 1. Helping their children to understand the importance of class formation, and
- 2. Supporting placements that have been made.

Given appropriate support at home and at school, it has been our experience that the vast majority of placements are successful. Where a placement is proving to be difficult, we ask that parents and students give it the time required for friendships to develop and comfort level to increase. *If you feel you would like to make a request for placement for the school team to consider, based on educational rationale, please contact Mrs. Ziprick through e-mail between Friday, April 30 and/or prior to Monday, May 10, 2021 (only) at tziprick@retsd.mb.ca.*

Given the criteria used to generate class groupings, it is difficult to accommodate requests to place a particular student with another student or group of students. It is equally difficult to accommodate requests for a particular teacher, <u>as teachers often change teaching assignments</u>, or need to be on leaves of absence unexpectedly.

A deadline date is important to adhere to as once the teachers have had the conversations and have grouped students together; it is very difficult to make changes as each child in a class fits together like a jigsaw puzzle. Please be aware that educational rationale will be considered seriously by the teaching team but it is in no way a guarantee of your child's placement. It is at this time that we have to trust the team's professional judgement as they have the "big picture" perspective that parents would not have .

Student placement information is provided on Wednesday, June 30, 2021 in the child's end of year package.

To assist us in planning for 2021-2022, please call the school office at 204-663-5078, if you have not already done so, if your son or daughter is not returning to SHS in the fall (<u>not including those students advancing</u> <u>to grade 6</u>).

Kindergarten Registration for the 2021-2022 school year started on Monday, March 1st.

We would appreciate it if parents registered their students as soon as possible to assist us with appropriate staffing for 2021-2022.


Please see our SHS website for instructions on how to register while we are under COVID-19 restrictions.

Kindergarten registration is open for all children born in 2016. This means that your child must have had their 5th birthday on or before December 31st, 2016.

Registration Required Documentation:

Proof of Address: (2 items are required)

- *Driver's License
- *Manitoba Health Card
- *Tenancy agreement (duly signed)
- *Offer to purchase documents (completed with signatures)
- *Utility bill (name and corresponding address)



- *Birth Certificate
- *Baptismal Certificate
- *Passport
- *Health Card
- *Valid Treaty Card
- *Certificate of Birth registration, signed by Director of Vital Statistics (long pink form from the hospital at time of child's birth)

This information is very important and must be presented at the time of registration. Please pass this information to any neighbours or friends who have children ready for Kindergarten, but do not receive this newsletter. Thank you for your help.

School of Choice

Parents/Guardians do have the ability to make a request that their child attend a different school from the one designated by their home address by the school division. School of Choice requests for students living within the River East Transcona School Division will be accepted starting March 1st, 2021, but notification of acceptance will not be available until the end of June 2021.

*Please note that ÉSHS is closed to school of choice at this time.

Parents must complete the form along with the registration at their catchment school. The catchment school will then notify us of the request. Applicants will be notified by June 30th as to whether or not they have been accepted into the school of choice. Music Classes Moving Outside

The sun is shining, the air is warming up and with it come changes to the music program here at ESHS – under new MB Public health guidelines: Some singing may resume in K-12 schools!

Weather permitting, Grades 1-5 students will begin to have some of their music classes outdoors on the soccer field shortly after Spring Break. This allows us to experience the best ventilation around – fresh air! Not only is fresh air better for singing, but it is great for our general health as well.

When it comes to singing, the following safety guidelines have been established for River East Transcona music teachers:

- All singing moments will take place outdoors only and not in the classrooms
- A minimum of two metres of physical distancing should be maintained between participants.
- Students should be arranged facing forward in straight staggered lines (when singing) and must be facing slightly away from each other when singing
- The total number of participants may not exceed 25, including teachers/staff regardless of the size of the space.
- Maintain cohorts. No cross cohorting is permissible.
- There continues to be no singing of O Canada.

River East Transcona takes the safety of your children very seriously so we will proceed with extra caution here at ESHS at this time. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact your music teachers.

If you have a concern...

Your child's school will always try to make the learning experience a positive, safe and happy one for its students. However, if you have a concern or an issue, please don't hesitate to let the school know. Open communication between home and school is very important.



The RETSD Board of Trustees stresses the steps shown below must be followed if concerns are to be properly addressed. The trustees' role is to hear all sides of the concern before making a decision on any appeal, to be the link between parents and the division, and to help with divisional processes and policies (such as this concern protocol). They realize that there is no greater advocate for your child than you, the parent.

Here are the steps to follow if you have a concern:

Talk to the person most directly involved—your child's teacher. If you must leave a message, please be sure to provide a day and evening phone number where you can be reached.

If talking to the teacher doesn't resolve the issue, talk to the principal.

(The majority of parental concerns are resolved at either of the first two steps)

If you've talked to the principal and over a period of time the issue has not been resolved, call the superintendents department.

If your concern is not resolved by the superintendents department, you can make an appeal in writing to the board of trustees. The board of trustees will hear your appeal either in person or in writing, whichever you prefer.

Dear Parents/Guardians and Families,

As I am sure that you have noticed, the use and popularity of e-cigarettes and "vaping" has been increasing in Manitoba. These trends come after years of decreasing smoking rates across the province, particularly among youth.

This trend is concerning as the use of e-cigarettes is not without risk, with evidence emerging around addiction potential and harmful chemicals contained in the vaping liquid. Therefore, as a province, we want to ensure we are being proactive and that tobacco use is not simply being replaced by e-cigarettes.

My office has provided a reminder to all schools that the use of e-cigarettes (as with conventional cigarettes) in any enclosed public space, including schools, is prohibited under The Smoking and Vapour Products Control Act. This prohibition is important to ensure that smoking, be it tobacco or e-cigarettes, is not normalized or thought of as a risk-free activity.

As e-cigarettes are a relatively new technology, we want to ensure that parents are also able to access clear and balanced information to be able to talk to their children. We know that nobody is more influential on a young person's decisions than their parents and would therefore like to encourage you to explore the resources available from
