- 1. Extracurriculars Our grades 4 & 5 students had the opportunity to participate in basketball club. Those who joined and attended practices will take part in a basketball tournament on Monday, May 12.
 - Our grades 3, 4, and 5 students also had the opportunity to participate in floor hockey games, playing both for fun and to try to be the team who wins the Wayoata Cup. Final playoffs are coming up!
 - Our grades 3, 4, and 5 students also had the opportunity to participate in Marathon (Running) Club. Those who attended practices diligently will head to the Jog In The Park event at Assiniboine Park on Thursday, May 8.
- 2. Kindergarten Registration Kindergarten registration opened on March 1, and we have received a good number of registrations already, however we are expecting that there are many more to come!
