Welcome to a New School Year!

Wayoata students and staff have had a great start to the school year! Staff returned Sept 2nd for a coordinated day and engaged in meetings, URIS training, and prepared for the return of students. Once again, we really enjoyed having our Meet the Teacher Open House on the evening of the coordinated day, so that we could see our students and families, allow students to meet their teachers and see their classrooms, and families could visit many important learning spaces around the school and learn about Wayoata's beliefs and practices! This was also a great way to help alleviate some of the anxiety that is natural at the beginning of a new school year! Students then returned Sept 3rd already knowing who their teachers are, where their classrooms are located, and we had a very smooth and positive start to the 25-26 school year! On Sept 3rd, we also had 2 short school-wide assemblies - one to welcome new students, introduce new staff, and review/practice recess expectations, and the second to review lunch expectations and introduce our lunch supervisors.

- 4. Life Threatening Allergies We aim to be a nut/fish free school; notes are in process of being created for the safety of students with life-threatening allergies and will be sent home shortly. Stop signs on classroom doors will help identify life-threatening allergens specific to classrooms.
- **5. E-memo & Communication** Weekly e-memos will go out to families at the end of every week with reminders about *school-wide* events, important dates coming up, etc. Classroom teachers will communicate *classroom-specific* events/information.
- 6. School Website Our Wayoata School calendar on our website is in the process of being updated and will also include school-wide events & important dates. The school website also includes links/information about divisional programming and events.
- 7. Emergency Preparedness Teachers will be teaching/reviewing expectations for fire dills, lockdowns, and hold & secure drills with their classes over the coming weeks. We have 10 fire drills, 2 lockdown, and 2 hold & secure practices per school year. Fire drills will begin in September; Lockdown and Hold & Secure drills will occur later in the fall and again after the winter break.
- 8. School Plan Goals: Wayoata's School Priorities for 2025-2026 focus on Literacy, Numeracy, and Education for Sustainable Development. School Priorities align with RETSD's divisional priorities. RETSD's divisional priorities can be found on the RETSD website.
